Inline text definition of target size

Summary

(Previous version of this doc with lots more working.)

Iterating from the last meeting, the new proposal is:

Inline: The target is in a sentence, or the size of the target is otherwise constrained by the line-height of non-target text.

Inline: The target is in a sentence or in a list in the main content on the page, or the size of the target is otherwise docs;

Inline: The target is in a sentence, or is in a bulleted or numbered list, or its size is otherwise constrained by the line-height of non-target text;

Inline: The target is in a sentence or lists not for top or side navigation, or the size of the target is otherwise constrained by the line-height of non-target text;

- *** Note on internationalisation of line-height.
- *** Errata to align AAA version.

You can consider that to mean: Increasing the size of the target would increase the inter line spacing of non-target text.

Therefore, if you have a list with some items that include non-link text and some that don't, you consider the list as a whole.

The table below aims to compare the current text with the new proposal. Examples are from this Wiki page unless otherwise linked.

Conclusions from testing a Wiki page:

- Individual punctuation items do not count as "text", e.g. a colon;
- Metanav: Not logged in Talk Contributions Create account Log in Would be excepted, due to non-link text.
- If some bullets do include non-link text, and others don't, then all are excepted (if they are in the same list), as they are all dependent on the same line height.
- Left nav is not covered by the exception. Although the headings are non-links, they are separate from the lists of links.
- Ordered lists with numbers / letter **would** count as text, therefore are always excepted.
- Question about markers of lists, as the markers for ordered lists could be 'text', but bullets wouldn't be 'text'.
 - Suggestion for understanding doc: Indicators for ordered/unordered lists *are* considered text.
