The children and young adults read book nominations, determine their favorite, and then vote in an online process. The books with the most votes in California are the winners!

Categories include picture books, picture books for older readers, intermediate, middle school, and young adult. There are 5 nominated books in the picture book category and 3 nominations in each of the other categories. This is the 50th anniversary of this California program that encourages love of reading!

Voting processes for the California Young Reader Medal should be guided by a library staff member for submission. All votes are due by April 1, 2025 (postmark deadline for paper mailed ballots).
