## **CVC Facts**

## Related to the most recently expressed concerns

- For all Home and Teaching Colleges, the CVC is no longer requiring colleges to pursue 20% alignment with the OEI Rubric (POCR).
- Regardless of whether SRJC is a Home and/or Teaching College, all online classes will be listed in the Exchange, not just those that have passed a POCR review.
- Once a college is Local POCR certified by the CVC team, the certified college (not the CVC) gets to decide whether the course passed the POCR review.
- All classes that do pass the local POCR review process are given a quality "badge" and would appear higher in the search results on cvc.edu.
- Accessibility (addressed in section D of the Rubric) is a legal requirement, and the accessibility review is meant to help faculty be aware of any potential problems.
- If there are specific things in a course that are difficult or impossible to make accessible, the recommendation will be to find a way to accommodate students through DSPS (DRD), NOT to disallow the course being taught. These will be local decisions at the college.
- If a student were registered with their own college's DSPS (DRD) program, they would need to reach out to SRJC's DRD department in order to receive accommodations while enrolled in an SRJC class.
- As a reminder, SRJC has staff that will help faculty fix accessibility errors as requested/approved by faculty.

## Other CVC facts

- If SRJC has prerequisites in place for a course, then as the Teaching College those would be in effect for any outside students attempting to enroll in an SRJC class. The Exchange does allow students to submit documentation to the Teaching College for review to clear prerequisites. Some colleges choose not to put classes in the Exchange that have prerequisites attached to them. Students may also filter their search results to only include courses without prerequisites.
- According to the Exchange Implementation Board, as of 1-11-23 there are:
  - o 101 Consortium Colleges
  - o 90 Home Colleges
  - o 26 Teaching Colleges
- This is the <u>checklist</u> for becoming a Home College
- The steps for becoming a Teaching College are: (a) <u>enabling sending of e-transcripts</u> through eTranscript California (which SRJC has already completed), and (b) <u>enabling Super Glue</u> with the CCC Technology Center (which would need to be done by our IT staff, (c)enabling Ethos for Ellucian colleges, (d) completing all other prerequisites (such as the Course Finder API and becoming a Home College).
