## **OUR WHY & FOUNDATIONAL BELIEFS**

The Learning Conditions framework is an approach to operationalize our Inner Core vision, which asks educators to center students' identities, communities, and relationships. Research shows that the learning environments educators create can have a strong influence on students' sense of belonging and their learning beliefs.

As a district, we ground ourselves in the following foundational beliefs as we all do the work to embody the Inner Core—all students are capable of learning and improving, sharing power is necessary for inclusive youth-adult partnerships, and all students are experts in their own lived experiences and bring brilliance to the classroom.

## THE DAILY STUDENT EXPERIENCE & LEARNING CONDITIONS

Students' daily experience of their classroom Learning Conditions drives their engagement, perseverance, and learning – and shapes longer term academic outcomes, identity development, and well-being. The nine Learning Conditions name aspects of the classroom experience that serve as a precursor to meaningful learning.

By continuously centering student perspectives to support reflection, shape teaching practice shifts, and guide our decision making, we embody what it means to be culturally inclusive and responsive, anti-racist educators and student leaders in authentic learning communities with one another within CPS.
