That reaction seems a little understated to me. "Gods among us." "Indeed."

So then everyone catches up with little fanfare, Houndoom's owner is all

*ash "Well TECHNICALLY Togepi belongs to-"
"Ash! Shut UP!"

The old man reveals he sent houndoom to town to grab a new set of eyelash curlers but then WHOOPS looks like we're getting another round with team rocket, why not. They grab houndoom and the old man is beside himself with distress!

...doomie

Then it's yet another plain-cracker blast off with the added bonus of unceasing pain for the blastees. Seriously check the pokedex for houndoom, the pain NEVER CEASES.

*giovanni "Unceasing pain? Maybe I could find a use for that..."

And speaking of pain, it looks like we end on this painful trope once again!

Oh thank heavens, he was just being stern. Geez, don't scare me like that, once was more than enough!

Thoughts

This... was a movie short, done on the cheap. I could almost leave it there, but seriously, it follows all the tropes minus the fact that the humans are present. Minor conflict involving a cute mon, lots of quiet cozy moments, musical montages, a freaking cameo by a legendary pokemon... all you need is a larger budget and a mon from the next generation and it's ready for theatres! Too bad they don't really translate too well to TV.

See, for me the main draw of the movie shorts is as an excuse to show vignettes of pokemon doing cute and mundane things with a big ol' wad of cash behind it. The movies proper were for epic stakes but the shorts were to immerse you in the world with beautifully animated vignettes of cute mons doing cute things. However, episodes of the show, while certainly able to take breathers, still have the expectation of being just that: an episode. Here, while the basic shenanigans were there and team rocket...happened, there just wasn't much to hold my interest and it seemed unable to commit to either full breather or full conflict. I like breather eps when done right (like Po-ke corral) but it's really easy to get them wrong (like Way Off Day Off) and unfortunately this falls into the latter for me.

Which is a shame, as I like the concept! I mean, a dark, brooding loner with a heart of gold has to defend a defenseless infant he finds while working another job that also has sporadically bone-breakingly powerful abilities? Sounds like a formula for success to me! I also really like that it brought across a message of not judging by appearances really subtly by just having houndoom be intimidating but no one calls it out so it's the AUDIENCE who has to overcome their biases. But aside from those points and a couple of well animated shots it was still a cheap-feeling, bland attempt at a roadtrip episode. However, I can still see some people looking past it and appreciating the quiet moments even if I couldn't, so with that and the good points it's a poke ball.

Oh, and while I like good guy houndoom WHY ON EARTH WASN'T THIS EPISODE ABOUT DELIBIRD? Come on people, you bring out the evolution to a pokemon you showcased 30 episodes ago yet you ignore the LITERAL DELIVERY POKEMON? I just... why?

At first I thought she might be referencing a website that could have been popular at the time that slackers would hang out on, but the only Pinkslip.com I could find is long gone, and I couldn't find any references to it. Much more likely Jessie is referencing the dot com bubble of the late 90's, which was kind of an early version of today's silicon valley startups, where canny entrepreneurs got tons of money for making websites and doing very little until the bottom fell out and many of them became just unemployed slackers. Obviously there was way more to it then that but it's easily googled for more info. Heck there were even "pink slip parties" reported in 2001, the year the episode came out, where the recently terminated would hang out and try desperately to latch onto another line of work. It's fascinating and there's a link in the description if you want more info.

So Jessie says they were acting like pink-slipped, dotcom slackers, it was actually a cutting-edge pop culture reference that would make Family Guy blush!
