- 1. milieu surroundings, setting, environment
 - *Example: The *milieu* of the library is usually quiet.
- 2. <u>instigate</u> to urge, provoke, or incite to some action or course, encouraging someone else's action and usually suggesting dubious or underhanded intent
 - *Example: There has been an increase in the amount of violence **instigated** by gangs.
- 3. dubious doubtful, rousing suspicion; questionable; shady.
 - *Example: That *dubious* person has stolen from the store before.
- 4. **epiphany** a sudden insight to a puzzling problem
 - *Example: A few years ago, I had an **epiphany** that helped me think of an answer.
- 5. **apropos** appropriate to, fitting, applicable, relevant.
 - *Example: It's *apropos* that I am wearing a Star Wars outfit on Star Wars Day May the 4th.
- 6. <u>ironic</u> strange or funny because something (such as a situation) is different from what you expected. strange or funny because it's unexpected
 - *Example: It's *ironic* that he got a ticket for speeding since he teaches students how to drive.
- 7. **typical** usually, normally, having the distinctive qualities of a particular type of person or thing.
 - *Example: It is *typical* for that student to be late to school because he is always late for everything.
- 8. **beeline** a straight line between two places.
 - *Example: When you return from the bathroom, make a beeline to your seat.
- 9. **commodity** a useful or valuable thing, such as water or time.
 - *Example: "Water is a precious *commodity.*"
- 10. **<u>quiver</u>** tremble or shake with a slight rapid motion, as in a vibration.

- *Example: Whisper means your voicebox doesn't quiver.
- 11. <u>infractions</u>- violations or infringements; the act itself is very minor so the resulting penalty is minor. infringements

*Examples of *infractions* include parking overtime, speeding, and tailgating.
