<a href="#">sheriff</a>	Noun	The sheriff of the small town has a difficult job.
<a href="#">deputy</a>	Noun	The sheriff has three deputies that work for him.
<a href="#">track sb down</a>	Phrasal Verb	I am trying to track down Jim. Have you seen him?
<a href="#">capital</a>	Adjective	Capital punishment is also known as the death penalty.
<a href="#">offence</a>	Noun	He committed three offences and is now in jail.
<a href="#">swear</a>	Verb	I swear I am telling you the truth!
<a href="#">break in</a>	Phrasal Verb	Somebody broke into my car last night and stole my camera.
<a href="#">surveillance</a>	Noun	There are many surveillance cameras at banks these days.
<a href="#">burglar</a>	Noun	A burglar broke into my house last week.
<a href="#">thief</a>	Noun	A thief stole my laptop from the classroom.

<a href="#">investigation</a>	Noun	Police have started an investigation to find out what happened last night.
<a href="#">fugitive</a>	Noun	The man has escaped from jail. Police are looking everywhere for the fugitive.
<a href="#">suspect</a>	Noun, Verb	The police still do not have any suspects in the crime.
<a href="#">capture</a>	Noun, Verb	The entire crime was captured by my camera.
<a href="#">kidnap</a>	Verb	In many countries, kidnapping is a very common way for criminals to make easy money.
<a href="#">property</a>	Noun	Please treat my property like you would treat your own.
<a href="#">publicity</a>	Noun	Putting the photo of the criminal in the newspaper has created a lot of publicity about the crime.
<a href="#">surrender</a>	Verb	You should surrender and go to the police station.
<a href="#">federal</a>	Adjective	This tax is a federal tax.
<a href="#">commit</a>	Verb	The man is wanted for assaulting a store clerk.
<a href="#">admit</a>	Verb	She admitted stealing the candy.
<a href="#">deny</a>	Verb	She denied stealing the candy.
<a href="#">flee</a>	Verb	The criminal has fled the country.

<a href="#">citizen</a>	Noun	Citizens can help the police by calling them and telling them what they know.
<a href="#">cooperation</a>	Noun	Please cooperate with me so that we can do this faster.
<a href="#">sin</a>	Noun	It is a sin to steal from others.
<a href="#">lust</a>	Noun	Some people have such a strong lust for money.
<a href="#">envy</a>	Noun	It isn't good to be full of envy of someone.
<a href="#">greed</a>	Noun	Greed caused the man to steal the food.
<a href="#">pride</a>	Noun	He will not admit to the crime because of his pride.
<a href="#">ensure</a>	Verb	Please ensure that you lock the door when leaving.
