Did you know?

Native Americans used music for emphasis in various parts of their lives. The music served different functions such as in healing ceremonies, work songs, storytelling, success in hunting, and socially for celebrations.

Common Instruments

Drums, flutes, rattles and whistles were the main instruments the tribes used to accompany their singing. Instruments were made out of the materials from the world around them: trees, animal hides, ocean shells, reeds, turtle shells, goat nails, hooves from animals, gords, bones and many other mediums found in nature.

Music and Dance

Dances also served various functions in everyday life of the tribes. They were used to celebrate wedding ceremonies, courtship, a successful harvest, healing, storytelling and other social occasions.
