Luke 20:19-47

Render to Caesar: 20:19-26

Principle over Law Quiz: speed limit, red light, sign in absentia, 1 Timothy 2:8-10

Avoiding the either/or trap: Herodians and Pharisees

Render to Caesar: determine what is appropriate: see Matthew 7:6; 1 Corinthians 9:19-23; Romans 13:1

Render to God: Everything is God's!

With Jesus words are <u>containers</u> that hold principles

Caught in the Passage: 20:27-44

The sin of using Scripture as a "law-tool" to further your agenda

Assumption that words are like <u>rocks</u>: singular, firm and manipulatable

Example: The law of levirate marriage: Deuteronomy 25:5-10

Used as a logic game to challenge the idea of resurrection

Overlooking the principle of preserving a family name, generational security

Jesus plays their "rock game" with them: the God of Abraham, of Isaac, of Jacob

To expose their weakness, Jesus initiates a word-rock language game with them

The Messiah: David's son or Lord?

They can be manipulated by the the very tool with which they manipulate

Exposing them as "pretenders" masquerading over greed: 20:45-47

Jesus' Way of Teaching the Scriptures:

Technical Torah word play was not His usual way of teaching

Parables, stories, questions, metaphors, observations, principles

People recognized authority in Jesus' teaching: Matt 7:9, Mark 1:22, Luke 4:32

Fulfilling the Law versus following the Law: see Matthew 5:17-18

You have heard it was said, but I say to you: Matthew 5:21-48

The Bible is not Book of Rules, neither is it a Behavior Manual (rocks)

He gave us a container, a space created by His words, in which to forever encounter Him: Matt 24:35

We will never solve the subjective hermeneutic problem in the Church

But when there two or three are gathered: Matthew 18:20

It is Jesus Himself that will show us "what belongs to Caesar and what belongs to God"
