

Privacy policy

Effective 10 August 2026. This policy explains what Proveit collects about you, why, who can see it, and what you can do about it. It is written to be read rather than to be survived.

The short version:

Proveit shows what you post to the friends you have chosen and to nobody else. We do not sell your information, we do not advertise, and we do not track you across other apps or websites. There is no advertising identifier in this app and no profile is built about you for marketing. You can delete everything from Settings, permanently, without asking us.

What we collect, and why:

Your account. Your name, your email address, the handle you choose and your profile picture if you set one. Your email address signs you in and lets you reset your password. We only accept addresses from mainstream email providers, so that an account can be traced to a real inbox if it is used to abuse somebody.

What you post. The promises you make and their times, the photographs you take as proof, your comments, your reactions, and whether each promise was kept, quit early or missed. This is the service: it exists to be shown to the friends you chose.

Photographs. Proof photographs are taken with both cameras from inside the app and stored in Google Cloud Storage. Before they are uploaded we re-encode them and strip the embedded metadata, including any location tag the camera recorded. A photograph you post therefore does not carry where it was taken unless you separately chose to attach a place.

Location, only when you ask for it. A proof carries a location only when you tap to attach one at the moment of posting. We then record the coordinates and, where available, a place name. Proveit never reads your location in the background and never without that tap. You can refuse or withdraw location access in your device settings at any time.

Your device. A notification token so that our servers have an address to send to, and the difference between your clock and universal time so that streak reminders arrive in your evening rather than ours. When you send feedback or a report we attach the app version and your operating system version so that we can reproduce what you described.

Safety records. Reports you file, reports about you, and the list of people you have blocked. A report includes a copy of the content complained about, taken at the time, because the person who posted it can delete it a moment later.

What we do not collect:

We do not use advertising identifiers, advertising networks, or third-party analytics. We do not track you across other apps or websites, and we do not build an advertising profile about you. We do not ask for your contacts or your calendar. We do not read the photographs already in your library; the only photograph we read from it is one you deliberately pick as your profile picture.

Who can see what you post:

Only the friends you have accepted, and only those inside the groups you selected when you posted. Somebody who is not your friend cannot see your promises, your photographs, your comments or your record. Removing a friend withdraws their access to everything you have posted, including things posted before, and blocking somebody does the same and prevents them contacting you again.

This is enforced on our servers, not merely hidden in the app. Every post carries the list of people entitled to see it, and our security rules check that list on every read.

How long we keep it:

Until you delete it. Deleting a promise, a comment or your account removes it from our systems. Deleting your account is immediate and permanent, and covers your promises, your photographs, your comments, your reactions, your record, your handle and your profile.

Reports and safety records are kept for longer, because a record of abuse that vanishes when the account does is of no use in protecting anybody. We keep those no longer than we need them for that purpose.

Notifications:

We send push notifications about promises coming due, about what your friends promise and prove, about replies and reactions to your posts, and about your streak. Your device also schedules some reminders locally so that they arrive without a network connection. You can turn all of this off in your device settings.

Your rights:

You can see and change most of your information inside the app, and delete all of it from Settings without contacting us.

Depending on where you live you may also have the right to ask for a copy of your data, to have it corrected, to have it erased, to restrict or object to how we use it, and to complain to your data protection regulator. Write to pruveit.app@gmail.com and we will respond within the time the law allows, and in any event without undue delay.

Keeping it safe:

Access to your data is controlled by security rules evaluated on our servers for every read and write, not by the app on your phone. Traffic is encrypted in transit. Passwords are handled by Firebase Authentication and are never visible to us. No system is perfect, and we will tell you and the relevant regulator about a breach where we are required to.

Children:

Pruveit is not intended for anybody under 13, and we do not knowingly collect information from children. If you believe a child has an account, tell us at pruveit.app@gmail.com and we will remove it.

Changes to this policy:

We will update this policy as the app changes. The version and date shown at the top of this page tell you which version you are reading. If a change is significant we will tell you in the app.
