Technology

Absences/Tardies

Any notes/handouts from a class can be obtained from the class binder located in the room. Students are responsible for asking the teacher if they are confused about anything; this can be done in person or through an email/classroom comment.

<u>Grades</u>

Grades will be assigned a point value based on length and complexity. At the end of the grading period, a percentage of the total points possible will be calculated and a grade will be assigned. Grades will be recorded in PowerSchool and can be viewed online. In PowerSchool, a green checkmark means an assignment has been turned in, two dashes (--) indicate I have not finished grading/entering the assignment. A zero signals the assignment was not turned in. If you have a question about a specific grade, please contact me as soon as possible, as an error may occasionally occur.

** It is expected that each student maintains an organized binder/folder with each graded assignment for the current quarter neatly placed inside. This binder/folder needs to come to class daily. If a grade is in question, comparing the written grade on the assignment and the Powerschool grade will clear up the confusion quickly. If a disagreement about a grade should arise and the student cannot produce a graded assignment, the grade in PowerSchool will remain.
