

TWO-STEP AUTHENTICATION ON TWITTER


DIGITAL SECURITY: WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

WHAT IS TWO-STEP AUTHENTICATION, AND WHY SHOULD I USE IT FOR TWITTER?

Two-step authentication (also known as two-factor authentication) requires an extra layer of verification when your account is accessed from an unknown device. For example, if you try to log in to Twitter from a friend's computer, Twitter will text a passcode to your cellphone that you must enter to access your account. Two-step authentication helps prevent unauthorized access from third-party devices.

SETTING UP TWO-STEP AUTHENTICATION ON TWITTER FROM YOUR COMPUTER

1. Go to the Twitter Settings Page: <https://twitter.com/settings/account>
2. Find the section titled "Security" and the setting "login verification."

3. Click on "verify login requests."
4. Click "Start." You will be prompted for your Twitter password.
5. After entering your password, Twitter will show you the phone number tied to your account. Click "Send Code."
6. Now check your SMS messages. You should receive a code from Twitter:
7. Enter the code into the box on the Twitter website:


8. After you enter the code, click "Submit." You should receive a success message. You're enrolled!

SETTING UP TWO-STEP AUTHENTICATION ON TWITTER FROM YOUR PHONE

1. Open the Twitter app on your phone. Tap on “Me” in the bottom right corner and then the gear icon in the top right.



2. Select “Settings and Privacy” in the dropdown menu.



3. Tap on “Account.”
4. Tap on “Security.”
5. Turn on the switch next to “Login verification.” Tap “Confirm” on the bottom of the screen.
6. Follow the directions from “Setting up Two-Step Authentication on Twitter From Your Computer” starting at Step 3.

SAFEGUARDS TO SUPPORT TWO-STEP AUTHENTICATION

After you set up two-step authentication, Twitter will prompt you to save some backup codes. You should download these backup codes and store them in a safe place. You can use them instead of having Twitter text you a login code if you ever lose your phone, or are traveling and can't receive a

text message. Make sure that you put the print out of the codes in a safe place where you won't lose them!
