#### Вступ

Представлена розробка є актуальною в контексті розв'язання завдань навчально-виховної роботи у вищій школі. Зміст базується на програмі іншомовної підготовки здобувачів вищої освіти очної та заочної форм навчання, відповідає вимогам до знань, умінь, навичок студентів, визначених у стандартах вищої освіти, затверджених Міністерством освіти і науки України та дескрипторах рівня С1 відповідно до Загальноєвропейських рекомендацій з мовної освіти у сфері викладання, вивчення та оцінювання рівня володіння англійською мовою.

Кожен з десяти комплексних тестів, що входять до збірника, містить 100 завдань. Відповідна організація змісту дозволяє реалізувати функцію контролю та здобувачів оцінювання результатів навчання вищої освіти засадах модульно-рейтингової системи. Завдяки цьому забезпечується гнучкість використання запропонованої розробки 3 метою здійснення поточного, підсумкового та вибіркового контролю засвоєння навчального матеріалу, а також, належна ефективність оцінювання рівня володіння англійською мовою студентами вищих навчальних закладів.

Зміст завдань охоплює відповідне коло граматичних тем, що відображають вимоги до володіння англійської мови на рівні С1. Зокрема, Futures (revision); Inversion with negative adverbials; Mixed conditionals in past, present and future;

Modals in the past; Narrative tenses for experience (including Passive), Passive forms; all Phrasal verbs (especially splitting); Wish/if only regrets.

Представлений збірник тестів має на меті допомогти викладачам закладів вищої освіти ефективно здійснити підсумковий контроль опанування англійської мови на рівні С1, а також, за необхідності, визначити прогрес навчальних досягнень здобувачів вищої освіти в процесі опанування англійської мови загального спрямування відповідно до окремих етапів проходження навчальної програми в межах запропонованих тем, які умовно можна узагальнити таким чином: «Соціальні питання», «Комунікації та технології», «Міжособистісні відносини», «Організація часу», «Здоровий образ життя», «Оточуюче середовище», «Навчання».
