## **Theological Doctorate and Promotion to CAP Major**

Have you been an appointed CAP Chaplain, Captain for a year or more and hold an ATS accredited doctorate in a ministry related field? If so, you may be eligible for promotion to Chaplain, Major without completion of any other CAP Education & Training Program levels.

Pursuant to CAPR 35-5, Paragraph 5.3.1.3., "A clergyperson with an earned doctorate degree in a ministry related field and one year time-in-grade as captain" may be promoted to Major. Generally, a chaplain who holds an ATS accredited ministry related doctorate appointed in the grade of Captain will automatically be promoted to Major by CAP/HCA at the completion of one year time-in-grade as Captain.

However, should you complete your ATS accredited doctorate in a ministry related field *after* your appointment as Chaplain, you may be eligible for promotion to Major if you have completed a year time-in-grade as a Captain. In this case, you will need to send a sealed official copy of your transcript indicating the award of a ministry related doctorate to CAP/HCA and initiate a CAPF 2, Request for Promotion Action, checking the boxes for promotion to Major in Section III and Item III, Block 2. Special Appointment/Promotion, indicating the promotion is for "Exceptional Qualifications."

In Item VIII on the reverse side of CAPF 2, please indicate the following information:

- 1. Promotion to Major is requested for completion of an ATS accredited doctorate in a ministry related field.
- 2. Date of Rank to the grade of Captain.
- 3. Type of doctorate awarded (e.g. DMin, ThD, PhD, etc.), the field of study of the doctorate (e.g. Theology, Church Planting, Homiletics, etc.), and the date doctorate was awarded.
- 4. Name of ATS accredited institution awarding doctorate.
- 5. Date a sealed official copy of transcript awarding doctorate degree was sent to CAP/HCA.

The completed CAPF 2 shall be signed by your immediate commander and sent directly (scanned email copy preferred) to CAP/HCA. This promotion is exempt from review by the entire chain-of-command as specified in CAPR 35-3 and CAPR 80-1.
