May 2024- January 2025. **Policy Advisor to the Secretary (Biden-Harris Political Appointee)**, U.S. Department of Health and Human Services- Washington, DC.

I manage a fast-paced policy portfolio which consists of Medicaid (CMS), Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA), Office of Global Affairs, behavioral health, gun violence and other crosscutting policy areas such as tribal issues, justice-involved individuals, homelessness, and health-related social needs in support of the Department's goals. In this role, I strategically analyze policy documents and provide assessments related to policy issues critical to the Department's mission. I work with the Secretary's senior counselor that oversees the policy portfolio and ensures timely, organized, and accurate processes across the team. I communicate effectively across the agency's operating divisions and with the Administration, ensuring a positive work

environment while navigating pressing deadlines and co-occurring emergencies while being politically savvy. I manage and create talking points for the Secretary and keeps the policy team abreast of all rollouts and updates within the portfolio. I build and coordinate internal coalitions on behavioral health workforce and gun violence prevention. I participate or represent HHS in stakeholder meetings to engage partners in discussions around research areas pertinent to informing policy, advancing the priorities of the Administration, and sharing federal resources.

August 2022- May 2024. **AAAS Science and Technology Policy Fellow**, National Institutes of Health- National Cancer Institute- Center for Cancer Training, Center for Global Health, and previously the Division of Cancer Epidemiology and Genetics' Office of Education- Shady Grove, MD. AAAS sponsors this fellowship, which includes me working to strengthen the various initiatives in the training director's office. I support the fellows conducting cancer research through career development, career pathways, seminars, workshops, and training. I oversee the summer internship, seminar series, advise the Black Cancer Researchers group, and support the DEIA initiatives regarding recruitment, retention, and fostering partnerships with HBCUs and MSIs. Lastly, I co-chaired the Mentoring Subcommittee under the NIH-level training directors committee and attend NCI-level training director meetings.

May 2017- May 2024. **Founder and CEO**, Black Women PhDs, LLC, New York, NY. I support Black Women and Women of Color through their doctoral journey, and I organized an executive leadership team which launched a global ambassadors program with nine clusters throughout numerous countries. I develop programs and events to uplift and support over 1,700 doctors and future doctors. I am responsible for the budget and maintaining the social media presence (35K followers on Instagram), oral and written communication on behalf of the organization, and partnering with various corporations (ex. Facebook), recruiters and stakeholders (invited keynote at Clarkson University).

September 2021- August 2022. **AERA Congressional Science and Engineering Fellow**, Office of U.S. Senator Christopher A. Coons- Washington, DC. This fellowship is sponsored by AAAS and AERA, and entails me serving as a health and education policy staffer for a member of Congress. I am responsible for meeting with constituents, writing memos, briefings, and working to connect policy to practice. I use my education, international education, and mental health expertise to inform federal policy that impacts constituents. I meet with C-suite leaders, educators, and key stakeholders to determine applicable policies, resources, and appropriations that apply to their needs. At community events, meetings, and hearings, I staff the Senator by providing logistics, talking points, and background knowledge applicable to the meeting. I often collaborate in a bipartisan and bicameral capacity to draft legislation, co-sponsor legislation and host congressional caucus events. My portfolio includes HBCUs, educator burnout, National Service Caucus (AmeriCorps), preK-12 education, higher education, international education, and appropriations. My member chairs the HBCU Caucus, National Service Caucus, Appropriations Sub-Committee on State, Foreign Operations, and Related Programs (SFOPS), and they are a member of the Judiciary Committee, all of which I have contributed to throughout my time in the office.

August 2018- August 2021. **Tenure Track Assistant Professor of School Counseling/ Program Coordinator for the M.S. in School Counseling and Pupil Personnel Services (PPS) Credential Programs**, California State University- Fresno, CA. In this role, I coordinate and manage the graduate program with over 70 students enrolled. As the coordinator, I am responsible for program evaluation and aligning the program with national (AAQEP) and state (CCTC) accreditation standards and policies. I actively foster partnerships with local school districts and increase opportunities for School Counseling students within the community and the university. I balance teaching, scholarship, and

service. I teach Master's level School Counseling core courses and the Practicum for the overall Master's degree in Counseling. I meet with students regularly for supervision and advisement. I attend all department, school, and university meetings and participate in various committees. I collaborate with other faculty and students alike to support various projects. Under my leadership, the program has launched and formalized the School Counseling Ambassadors Program and expanded the visibility of the program, including social media presence. I serve as the liaison to the department, the college and the university. I tracked student success and updated the curriculum to meet the national and state accreditation standards. I chaired the search committee for a faculty hire and facilitated diversity and equity-based programs for the university and local community. The Practicum course included live supervision to students (supervised live clinical sessions during class time and consulted with students on key ways to improve the session and address the clients' presenting problems, and facilitated group supervision). I participated in live clinical sessions throughout the semester, often when clients were in crisis, to provide additional support.

I am responsible for providing workshops for school staff related to behavior management. I provided individual and group counseling services to students. I attended meetings outlined for school counselors and educators in Barbados.

Throughout this program I developed diplomacy skills and maintained collaborative working relationships with Faculty Mentors and Multicultural Directors.
