This sacrifice is made present on the altar at every Mass. It is the same sacrifice of Jesus upon the Cross: Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity. This sacrifice is presented in an unbloody manner; it is the perfect offering of the perfect victim to God the Father by the High Priest, Jesus
- ____ We unite ourselves with Jesus as an offering to the Father when we receive Holy Communion, the culmination of the Mass
- ____ The assembly participates by prayers, hymns, psalms, responses and an inner-offering to the Father in union with Christ in the Eucharist
- ____ The Mass is also offered for the Holy Souls in Purgatory, so they might more quickly enter Heaven
