

TURN QUESTIONS INTO KEYWORDS

Get the most out of your search by developing your research question into keywords.

This activity quickly guides you through a few key strategies designed to help you explore your topic and get ready to research. Breaking down your research question into keywords is an important step in the research process. Good keywords will help narrow your search while capturing a broad scope of potential articles to enrich your research.



Construct Effective Searches

Asterisks and Quotations

- Use an asterisk (*) at the end of a root word to find multiple endings, i.e.:
 - empath* =

empathy empathetic empathize

- Place quotation marks (") around an entire phrase instead of just its component parts to see results that contain the words in that specific order, i.e. "social intelligence"
