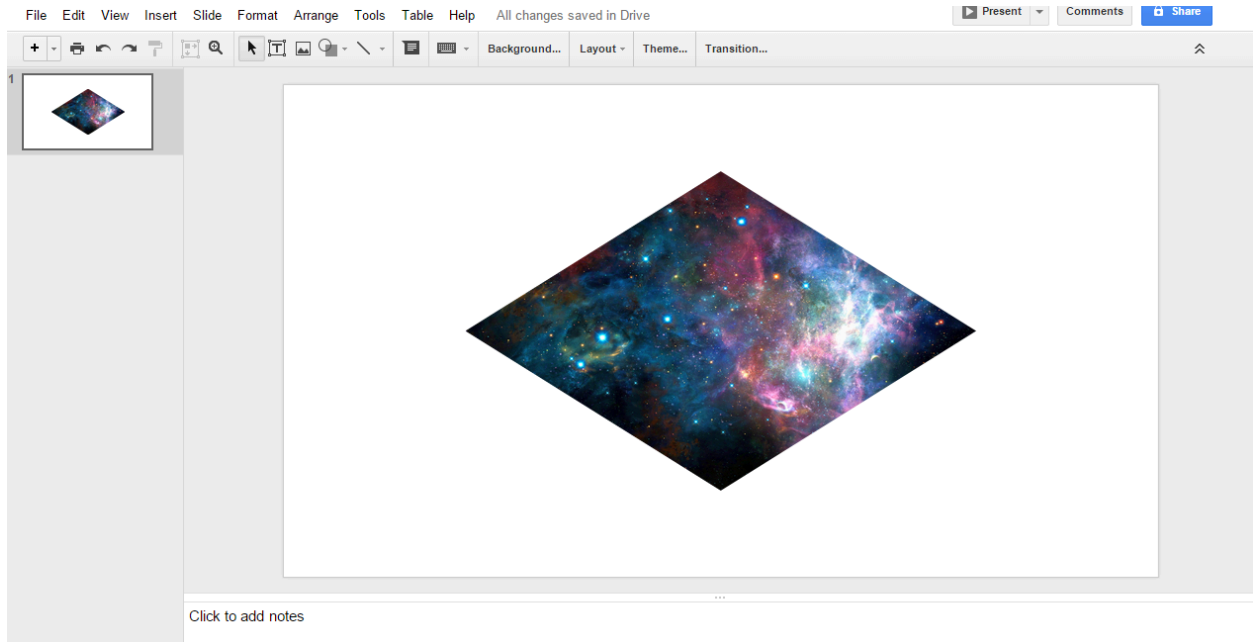


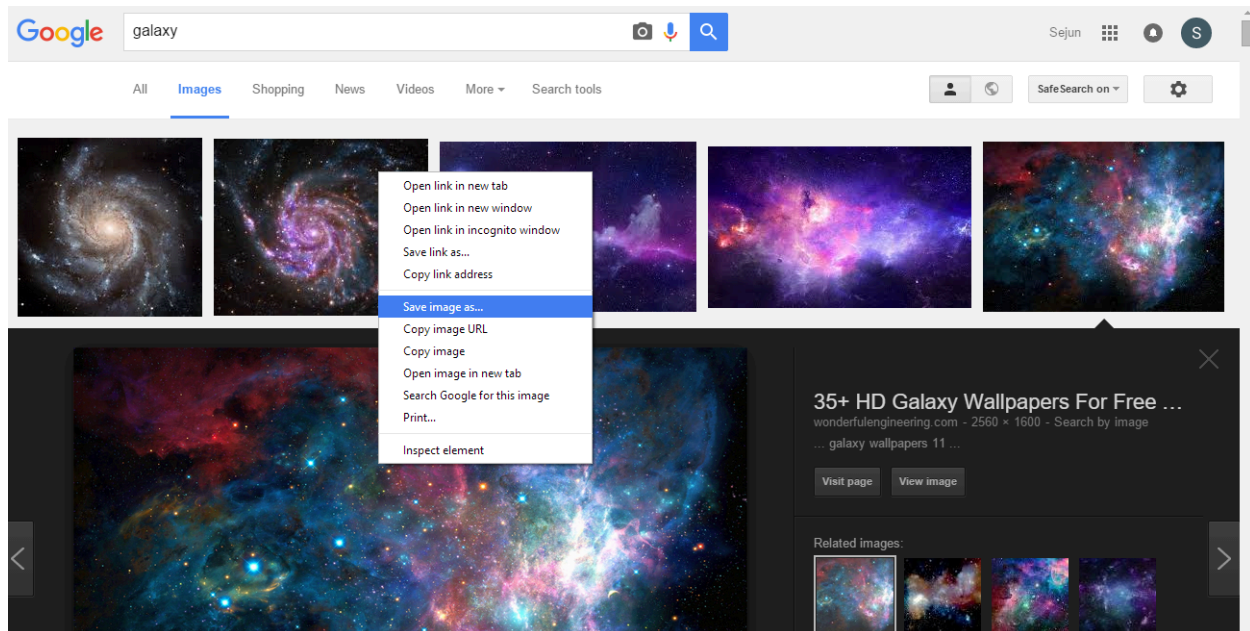
HOW TO CROP AN IMAGE INTO A SHAPE

Possible Final Result



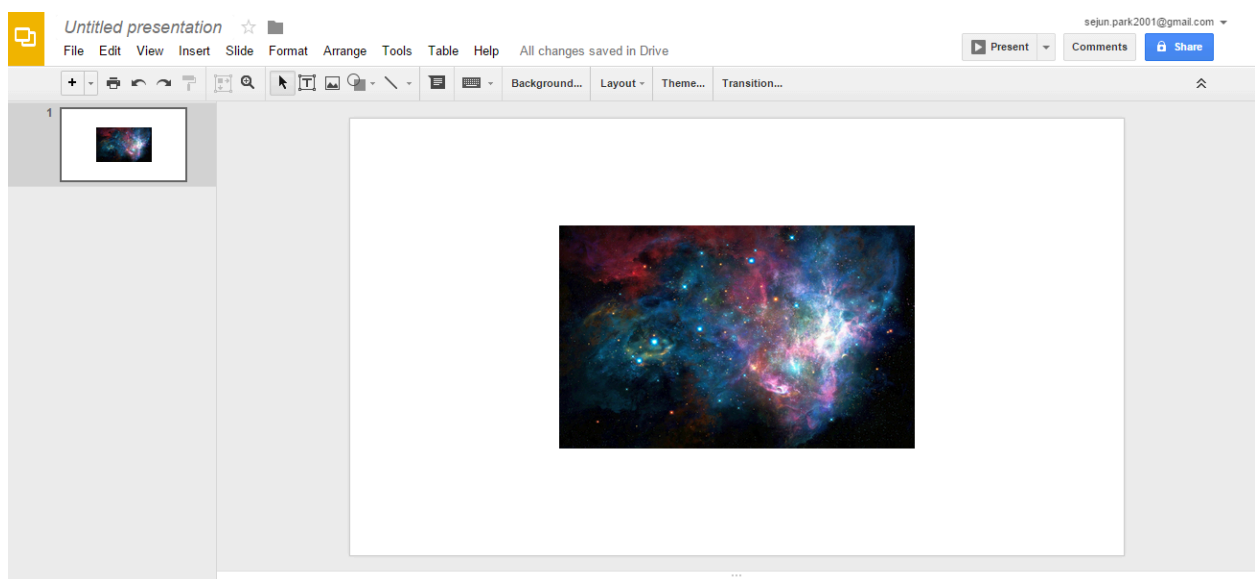
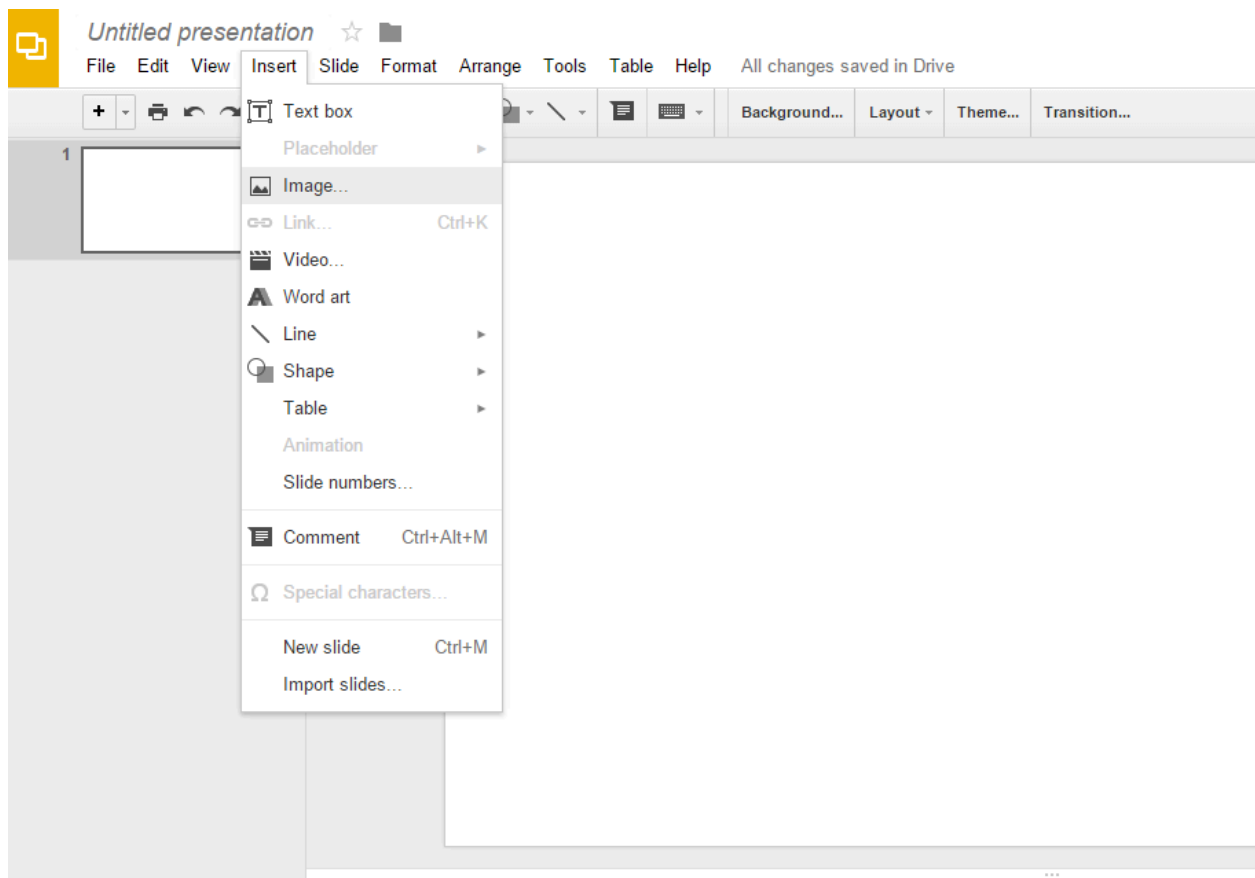
Step One: Find an image that you would like to crop into a shape

save the image into one of your folders (remember this file!)



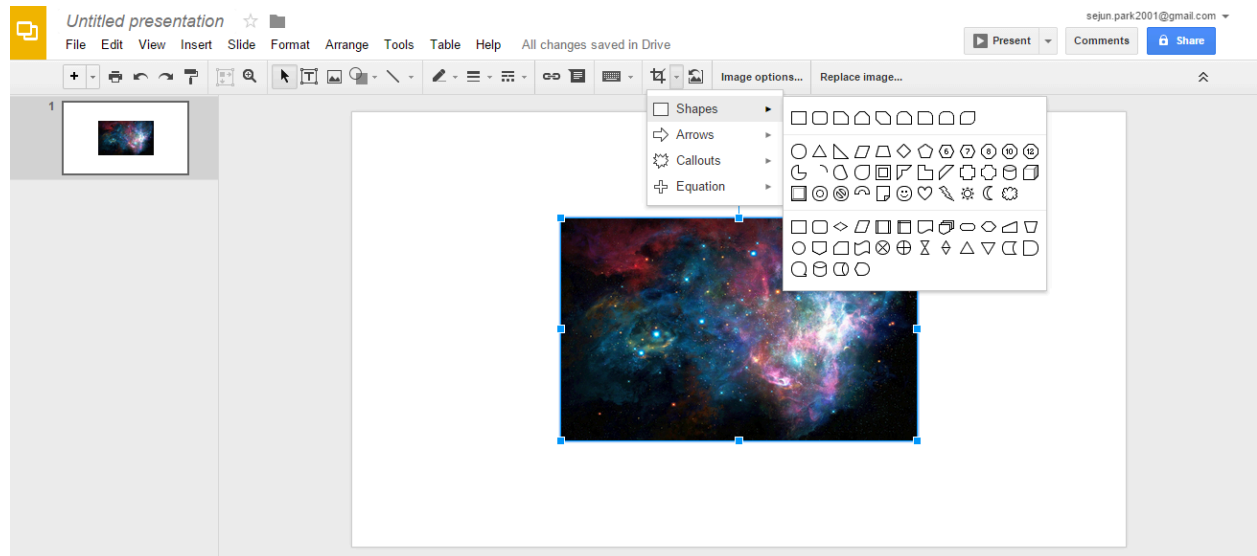
Step Two: Create a google slides document, and import the picture into the presentation

*resize the picture down to a desirable size. If you want to create an image that is cropped and requires equal length on every side, such as a square or a right triangle, and you have saved a rectangular image, skip to **Step Four**.*



Step Three: While the image is selected, click the crop icon that appears in the toolbar.

To pick a shape, click the dropdown arrow next to the crop button. To crop the image, click the icon itself.

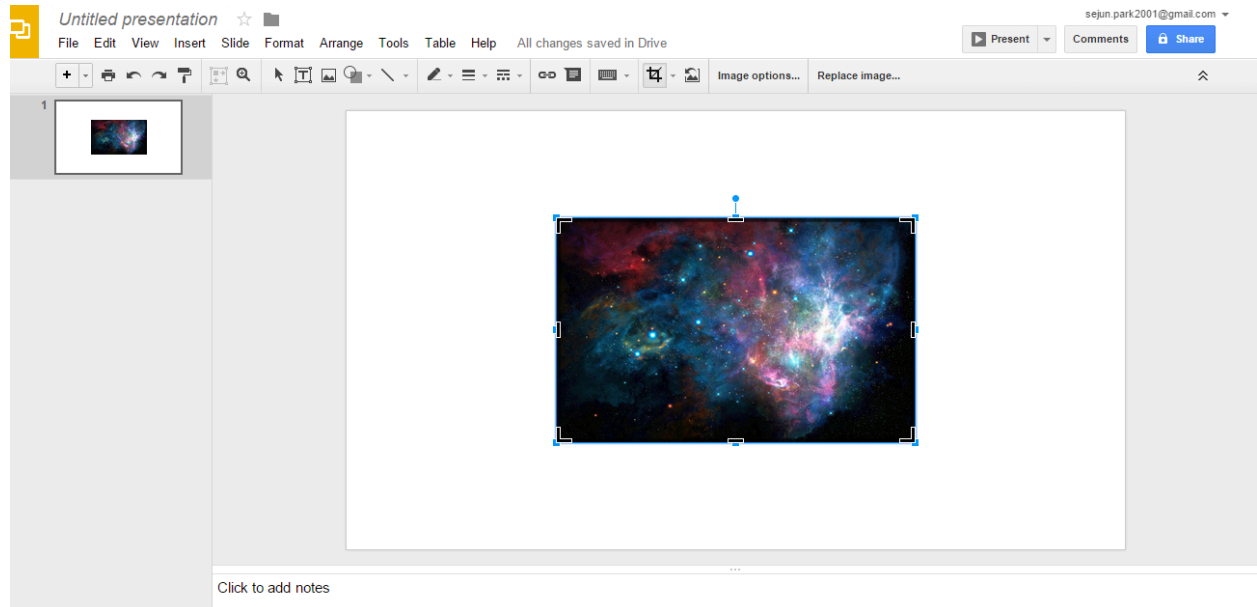


After selecting the shape you would like, the image should be automatically shaped to be fitted into the object. If the shape is not what you would like, continue to Step Four.

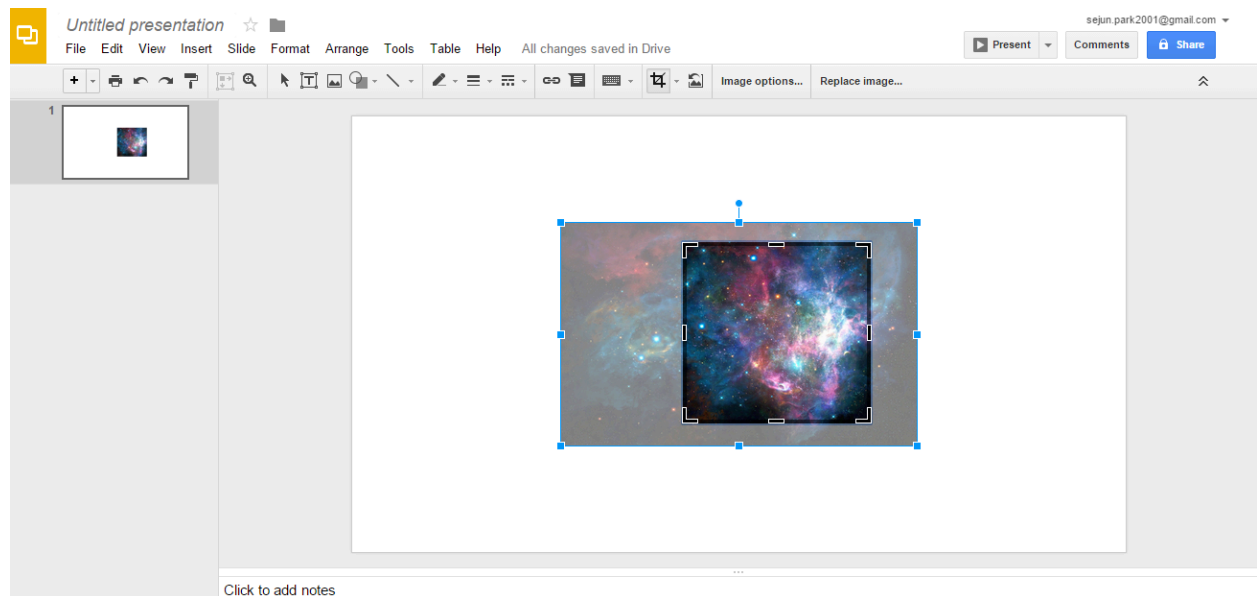
if the image you imported into the presentation is meant to be cropped into an object with equal lengths on each side, such as a square or right triangle, continue on with the following steps.

Step Four: Crop the image into a square/close to square size

As stated in the previous step, the crop button has two parts; the icon and the dropdown arrow. To crop the image into a square first, click on the icon itself or double click the image. Lines should appear on the image in the sides and corners.



Step Five: Adjust the corners or sides to create and select the square area of the image you want to keep.



Step Six: Click outside of the image to set the crop. Then repeat Step 3 to select an object/shape that you want the image to be cropped into.
