Problem Question

Task

Prep Work

- Work with ONE partner from class or by yourself.
- Refer to teacher screencast of How to Make a Ted-Ed Video.
- Create a Ted-Ed Activity that links a modern issue to the Progressive Era
 - Examples, but not limited to
 - Consumer issues
 - Regulation of corporations
 - Labor rights
 - Suffrage fights
 - Women's rights
 - Conservation/preservation movements
 - Issues regarding equity and race and segregation
 - Moral control (temperance, Victorian-era behavioral values, etc.)
- Find an informative video of your modern Progressive issue- should be no longer than 10 minutes. Videos should be reliable and accurate.
- Find 2-3 primary sources that are truly related to the activity. Explain how these sources are related to the modern issue in the Digging Deeper portion of your Ted-Ed Activity.

- Let's Begin: Write a compelling introduction in the Let's Begin section
- Watch: Find/load your video

- Dig Deeper: Link 2-3 **primary** sources from the historical Progressive Movement
