Attention Signal:	Class Class for immediate announcements Countdown with recognition from 5–4-3-2-1 for transitions		
Recognizing Positive Behavior:	Give first attention to best conduct. Posted on my teaching cart. Golden tickets as part of class wrap up		
Community Circles:	Class response circle once a month		
Responsible Use of Technology:	PPS expectations posted with explanations of responsible use of computers. Securely used to monitor computer use.		
Assigning/Collecting Classwork:	Assignments are posted on the slide deck for each class. Assignments are turned in in a marked box.		
Assigning/Collecting Homework:	n/a

Entry Routine:	Students are greeted,Come in and find carpet spot. There is a conversation starter on the slide deck		
Exit Routine:	Recollect at carpet spots for recognition, wrap up and lineup.		
Hallway Passes:	Hang by the door. Students get the pass and show it to me. When they see a thumbs up, they know they can use the pass. Hallway passes are not used during instruction time.		
Transitions:	Visual shared of transitions in class - from whole group to individual work to wrap up. Timers used to help students know when transitions will be happening.		
Instructional Routines			
Teacher-led whole group:	Expectations stated and reviewed. Set to be short (10 - 15 min max). Incorporating participation, repetition, response		
Independent Work:	Expectations clearly stated with transitions options posted on the slide deck.		
Collaborative Work (Partner/Group):	Options for partner work during most response and creation work.

Strategy/Practice	Description	
Peace Corner/Reset Space	Break space in the library with activities and a timer	
Restorative Practices	Checking in with student needs, identifying cause, making a plan	
Caregiver Communication	If there is a concern (attendance, behavior, academics), caregivers can expect a personal connection from me - phone call attempt and email and a way to respond back or ask questions. A followup conversation the next week (I tell the student and parent and use this opportunity to make it a positive conversation).
