3. I have been using the small size of Sirona cup for more than a year. I always thought I will never be able to shift to a cup and was comfortable with pads for a long time. But slowly and steadily I started reading, understanding and talking to people about it. I even

tried a tampon as a step towards the cup but I was very much uncomfortable and had immense pain using and I thought using a cup is out of the question. But after 8- 12 months after the tampon episode I finally ordered the cup and tried. It took a while to figure out the cup and the fold that works and how to insert it so that it opens inside. I also faced some concerns as my cervix is low but the cup worked out beautifully. I can't believe I was so hesitant and scared of trying it and now I can't think of using pads ever again. - 9. This cup is quite user-friendly- it is soft enough which makes it easy to fold and insert. I have not faced any leakage issues (I have only been using it for one day though!). I would recommend this cup for people who wish to switch to menstrual cup for the first time (and ofc old users looking for a good new cup!) I give it 4.5/5.
- 10. Experience of using Rustic Art cup (large size)

I'm a heavy bleeder and the large size is perfect for me. I can change once in 6 hours or so during heavy Flow. I still loved using it. Here are few points I wanted to share

The cup is medium soft so it's easy to insert and remove.

I was using a very soft cup before and had to use it with a cloth panty liner because it leaked a lot. But I didn't face leakages with rustic art cup. I used it during my heavy flow days too and it didn't really leak.

I was using 7 fold for inserting my previous cup but it didn't work for rustic art. It didn't open up properly so I am now using punch down fold. It took some time to practice insertion but I think it's worth it. When I try to touch it after inserting, it stays firm and doesn't collapse like a soft cup. I think it's of perfect softness so we're able to understand if it's inserted properly or not.

The cup is transparent which is really great in the sense that no extra dyes or chemicals have been used to colour the cup so I guess it's safer than coloured cups.

Along with being transparent it also has markings to measure quantity of blood loss which is really amazing. So I'm able to assess the blood loss better now.

The eco friendly menstrual cup wash provided with the cup is also really effective. Only if we add very little, it's more than enough. And I felt it cleaned the cup well. It's great to have a chemical free, natural cup wash powder so it doesn't harm us or pollute water.

The stem is not too big so it doesn't protrude. At the same time, it helps locate the cup easily.

Overall I had a wonderful experience using the cup. Personally I would love recommending this cup to others.

14. I use a medium sized cup from the brand called Sirona. I'm not sure if it's soft or hard, since I haven't had experience with any other brand, and it wasn't mentioned in the package. It is very easy to insert and take out (once you find the correct fold that suits you), but it has a volume of around 15ml which is lesser than a lot of other brands. So

one has to clean it ideally every 3-4 hours, instead of the 8-10 hours as promised on the package. If not cleaned every 4 hours, there might be leakage and odour, both of which I

personally face problems with.

I've been using it for almost a year now, and my experience so far has been good. I chose this brand merely because it was rated well and was cost effective, and it was my first time choosing a cup. Hence I won't be able to vouch for if it is better than other

GENERAL REVIEWS: I found the cup to be very comfortable. I was initially worried that the transparent cup might get stained after use, however, the cup comes along with a menstrual cup cleaning powder which cleared any such doubts that I had. Apart from this, the cup, till now, has proven to be suitable for me.

TIME PERIOD: 2 months

I bought the cup by directly texting the person related to the company.

I was even directed to talk to their customer care representative to clear any of doubts (like regarding leakages, softness, color, size, use etc) before I could buy the cup.

1. I have been using a wow cup. Bought it on Amazon. Been using for 4 months. I ordered a medium cup but received small. Since I was about to get my period, I didn't return the small cup. I keep using it. It's ok as far as capacity to hold the blood is concerned. And using it for a beginner is also ok. But it's pretty hard, and during the last few days of

using it, i found it extremely painful and uncomfortable. I was feeling much better when I just removed the cup. I am definitely not liking the experience because of this cup. I would not go back to pads for sure but I might need a better quality cup.

2. When I bought the Silky Cup a year ago, I knew nothing about cups; I just bought it because it seemed environmentally responsible! However, I subsequently read up a lot on the topic. Considering that I am short, I now understand why the standard cups don't work well for me. It's VERY important to measure the cervix position; there is useful info at <a href="http://www.wikihow.com/Buy-a-Menstrual-Cup">http://www.wikihow.com/Buy-a-Menstrual-Cup</a> and <a href="https://menstrualcupreviews.net/high-or-low-cervix/">https://menstrualcupreviews.net/high-or-low-cervix/</a>

The Silky Cup is rather stiff to handle. In fact, I need to use some gel to get it in, and it's a minor battle to hold the cup in the folded position. This product is definitely not for virgins, no matter what any FAQs may say. I am told SheCup is softer, but it's also 10 mm longer, so that's something to bear in mind. [EDIT: This was the case when I checked the dimensions online last year. Now, though, I see that SheCup may actually be a bit shorter!]

Hygiene: I think there is no issue. I have been using mine for about a year, off and on.

Comfort: If you are standing, swimming, walking, sitting or lying down, it is fine. However, if you have the issue that I have, you will find that the cup pops out the moment you go to the toilet. In such a case, you will need to remove and empty the cup, do your business, and re-insert it. This is why the size of the cup is very important.

Nonexistent customer service: I wrote to Silky Cup on their website last year itself, with my suggestions. Nobody cared to respond. You can also see that they have ONLY positive reviews on their website! SheCup is even worse; they only have several marketing channels; they do not have their own website where you can contact them.

Alternatives:

For those who have access to a supplier in the US or Europe, there are many choices. I recommend reading this post:

If you feel the cup is not for you, consider using reusable cloth pads. They are very comfortable because they have a cotton cover, unlike the commercial ones, where they use a polyester "dry feel" cover.

Environment tip: Whether I use the cloth pad or the cup, I rinse it in a designated mug of water, and then pour this water in the plants — it's good for them.
