REVEREND JAMES K. CUNNINGHAM, ADMINISTRATOR

Father James K. Cunningham was born in Elmhurst, New York on August 7, 1968. He is the youngest of four children of Eileen and the late Robert J. Cunningham of Woodside, New York. Father Cunningham attended St. Sebastian School, Woodside, St. Francis Preparatory High School, Fresh Meadows and St. John's University, Jamaica. At St. John's Father Cunningham received a bachelor's of science degree in business management. Father Cunningham studied theology at The Seminary of the Immaculate Conception in Huntington, New York where he received his Master of Divinity Degree. He was ordained a priest of the Diocese of Brooklyn on May 20, 1995 by Bishop Thomas V. Daily.

Father Cunningham served as Associate Pastor at Good Shepherd Church, Brooklyn and St. Bartholomew, Elmhurst before being appointed the Pastor of St. Mary Star of the Sea in Far Rockaway in January of 2002. On September 1, 2008 he was re-appointed as the Pastor of the newly merged parish of St. Mary Star of the Sea and St. Gertrude. Father Cunningham serves as board chairman of the Margaret Community Corporation and The Tablet, the diocesan newspaper of the Roman Catholic Diocese of Brooklyn. In 2011, Father Jim was appointed as the Administrator of Holy Name of Jesus Parish. He currently serves on the Board of Directors of the De Sales Media Group of the Diocese of Brooklyn.

REVEREND JAMES H. SWEENEY, PAROCHIAL VICAR

Father James H. Sweeney was ordained a Roman Catholic Priest on April 11, 1981. He returned to Holy Name in the summer of 2011 to serves as an Associate Parochial Vicar. He studied Spanish in the Dominican Republic and Guatemala and since his ordination has worked mostly with the Latino and African American communities in the diocese. He has served in the following parishes: St. Pius V, South Jamaica, NY (1981-1986), St Barbara, Brooklyn (1986-87), Transfiguration, Brooklyn (1987-1991), and served as Pastor at: Our Lady of Mercy, Brownsville, Brooklyn (1991-2001); St Agatha, Sunset Park, Brooklyn NY (2001- 2005) and Our Lady of the Presentation, Brownsville, Brooklyn (2008-2011)

Father Jim Sweeney injured his foot in 2003 and has had some mobility issues; while on medical sick leave (2004-2007) he helped out in the parishes: St Catherine of Siena, St Albans, Most Precious Blood, Astoria, Our Lady of Lourdes, Queens Village and Holy Name of Jesus, Brooklyn.

Father Sweeney grew up in Brooklyn (Flatbush/ Kensington) and attended Holy Innocents Grammar School and Cathedral Prep High School in Brooklyn. He attended Cathedral College Seminary in Douglaston and Immaculate Conception Seminary in Huntington, New York.

Father Jim is a self-taught artist and has enjoyed drawing and painting since he was a young adult. He tries to incorporate this ability in his priestly duties as another means of proclaiming the Gospel.

REVEREND MARK SIMMONS

I was born in Perth Amboy, NJ and grew up in New Jersey. I graduated from Most Holy Rosary elementary school and St Joseph high school. I then went to college attending Kean University in Union, NJ. I graduated with a BA in History. After graduation I worked in education for a few years. Then I entered St Charles Borremeo seminary in Philadelphia, PA studying for the Metuchen Diocese in New Jersey and graduated with a M.Div degree with a concentration in counseling.

After being ordained a transitional deacon I took time off. During this time I worked as a crisis counselor for special education students with behavioral issues. I also love music and worked in promotions with such bands as Matchbox Twenty and Goo Goo Dolls, and some Indie bands touring the East coast of this wonderful country.

I still felt called to the priesthood during this time and was accepted by Bishop DiMarzio for the Diocese of

Brooklyn. I was assigned to St Patrick's in Bay Ridge. I was then assigned 5 years later to Holy Name of Jesus Church.

DEACON ABEL TORRES

I was born July 12, 1939 in the small town Guanica, Puerto Rico. My father worked at the South Puerto Rico Sugar Company. In 1949, when I was 10 years old my father died and my mother moved us to Mayaguez the third biggest city in Puerto Rico. I attended school in Mayaguez.

At seventeen years of age, I emigrated to New York in 1956 and I have been here ever since. I worked in New York as a long shoreman and later on ships checking cargo. I also got my GED high school diploma,

I am married with three children and four beautiful grandchildren. Thanks be to God, I received the call from God to served as a Deacon. I studied for four years and the diocese ordained me in 1992. I have been serving the Lord for more than twenty five years.

DEACON THOMAS J. DEVANEY, MA, BCC

My parents emigrated from Ireland in the mid-1950's and settled in Queens, New York. My family attended Blessed Sacrament in Jackson Heights. I attended Saint Francis Prep, and was a member of the last graduating class from Brooklyn. I have two undergraduate degrees from Saint Francis College and SUNY. My graduate degree was earned in Pastoral Counseling from Fordham University; also, I studied spiritual direction at the Center for Spirituality and Justice, and Clinical Pastoral Education (CPE) at SUNY Downstate and Cabrini Medical Center earning board certification as chaplain in 1998 under the auspices of the National Association of Catholic Chaplains (NACC).

I was ordained to the diaconate in 1993 by Bishop Thomas V. Daily. My assignments have been at Saint John the Evangelist (21st Street), Immaculate Heart of Mary, and Holy Name of Jesus – all within the Park Slope – Windsor Terrace – Kensington section of Brooklyn. Currently, I am the Administrative Director of Pastoral Care at Hackensack University Medical Center in New Jersey. My ministry within the Diocese of Brooklyn includes serving on the Diaconal Council, Master of Ceremony for Bishops Sullivan and Sanchez, and Pre-Cana Instruction with my wife, Maureen – referred to by our administrator as D.W. – the deacon's wife.

Maureen and I are blessed with three children: Alanna – married to Mike, Claudia, and Sean; and one precious grandson – Logan.

DEACON FELIPE ALMENDAREZ

I was born November 21, 1948 in the state of San Luis Potosi, in the capital, the city of San Luis Potosi. I lived my childhood and part of my teenage life in that city, that is approximately 300 miles north from Mexico City.

If I need a few pesos, I would sell gum, shine shoes, and help ladies with groceries from small supermarkets to their houses. I used to bring lunch every day to people who work in the repair shop for all kind of trains. San Luis Potosi was a city branch to repairs locomotives in the country. I always had some money in my pocket.

My father after 21 years working for factory where piece goods were made for suits and high class clothing, he was let go. The factory was closed. He went to Mexico City and my mother Petra, my brother Victor, and my two sisters Lupe and Luisa follow a year and a half later. My religious mother died at 54 years old of cancer and my father at 84 years of old age.

From 1964 through 1970 I lived in Mexico City. I was 16 years old. Never the less I continuo my ways of survival; working all types of jobs, washing cars, repairing shoes, painting, carpentry, till I landed a job in a construction company and became a welder.

There was a confusing time that came after dating other girls; I met Juana in 1967, who is my 41 year wife today. After almost 4 years dating, she asked me if I wanted to come to United States to try my skills. Being profoundly in

love, I said yes, but in the back of my mine, I was thinking to make some money, come back to Mexico and make my own business. Never happened, I married Juana in October 3, 1970 by City hall and by the Church in February 6, 1971. Out of our marriage there were 3 daughters, Liliana, Cecilia and Virginia. After Cecilia was married; Liliana and Virginia were graduated from college and out of the house. In the year 2000 we became the guardians of Bleu and Lanaea Bailey, brother and Sister who their mother died of cancer. Bleu graduated from college and Lanaea is still looking to do something.

All my skills that I gain throughout my life in my home town, Mexico City and here in New York had helped me to provide 5 children and a wife what was needed for a family to live. Despite, not having any relatives or friends when I came to New York and not speaking fluently the language of English. I went to Kings Borough College in 1973 for less than a year, and 1981 to Queens College for 3 years, part time, I never graduated from Business Administration, but I retire as an assistant Administrator from the New York City Housing Authority.

I took all the training sessions and tests for promotions; training that gave me the skills to understand management to organize contractors and laborers to maintain complexes from 600 families to 2300 families.

Spiritually, I started to get involved since 1996. I did a retreat to become a Cursillista where I had a conversion and my life has changed direction, from the life that I was creating in my marriage from my 30's and my 40's. In my 50's I felt the call from the Lord to be his servant and here I am as Deacon; in May 28, 2011 I was ordained. I am having the happiest time of my life. I am trying to get confidence in my new world as a servant of the Lord Jesus Christ. I have found several people who are in the need of just a smile, word or just an arm to cross the street or to get from point A to point B. In my life I am between point A and B, but with the Lord blessing I will get to point B.

God has been calling for some time; here I am ready to take challenges that I never had before. Parishioners of **Holy Name**, the staff, priests and administrator have been very generous in having patience with me in this period of my life as a new Deacon. My wife and I knew from the beginning what was coming to be a Deacon and Deacon's wife. May the Lord give us the wisdom and guide us where He wants us to go.

The Adult Altar Servers are a group of parishioners who individually assist the priest at funeral masses held at

Holy Name of Jesus Church. Children are not taken out of school to help in this regard, and the parish relies on adult men and women to assist. Servers rotate as funeral masses occur. If we have five volunteers, then you will be asked to serve every fifth funeral. If you can't make it, we go to the next person on the list, and you will be called for the next funeral. Holy Name currently experiences about 45 funerals a year. The more people who volunteer, the fewer times any given person will be called. If we reach 10 volunteers, the expectation is that you would serve about 5 times a year. Training will be provided. This is a straight-forward easy ministry that serves the community and priest by having a second person on the altar to support the priest.

The Holy Name Cancer Guild 's has been in existence for over 50 years. The Cancer Guild prepares pads for the terminally ill residents of Rosary Hill Home in Hawthorne, N. Y.. These pads help the Dominican Sisters make the residents there a little more comfortable as they wait to return to God.

The sheets are cut into a prescribed measurement and a cotton lining is cut a little shorter, the two pieces are then pinned together and then sewn with a basting stitch. No fancy sewing skills are necessary since the pads are used only once and then discarded. When the work for the session is done, we enjoy a cup of coffee or tea, a piece of cake, and socialize for a short time. We collect \$1.50 from each member in attendance and after covering the costs of the refreshments, the remaining moneys are deposited in the Ministry's treasury and then used to purchase the rolls of lining and provide Christmas donations to Holy Name Church and the Rosary Hill Home.

The Holy Name Cancer Guild has been very fortunate in response to our request for donations of used sheets from parishioners and friends. If you have any gently used sheets you would like to donate, drop them off at the rectory and label them "for the Cancer Guild."

The Children's Liturgy Committee was created primarily to support the 10:30 Family Mass, which is in session September through June each year. A family is chosen each week to join the Procession of the Gifts, and then the children are invited to gather around the Altar for the Consecration, so that they can experience close-up the Eucharistic Offering of the Body and Blood of Christ

At the end of Mass each child is given a bulletin in which the readings are discussed again in the concrete manner that they can understand. The bulletin also offers individual and family activities in order to engage the children in more discussion of the day's readings.
