


Figure 1. Comparison of success rate of items in the experimental and control class. [It is noted that a figure has x axis and y axis completed with their units]

The complete reference list should appear alphabetically by name at the end of the paper. [We encourage to use references from journals as the main source. The use of references from other journals will be send back to authors for revision or will be rejected before peer-review].
