Essential question:

In what ways do historical relationships between Germany and Poland influence their current interactions post WW2?

Working Claim:

Germany and Poland's relationship is shaped by their complicated history after World War 2, leading them to interact cautiously while still trying to cooperate.

Supporting evidence:
