Decorate, setup seats, podium with three seats (Master of Ceremony, SM & Chairperson), take Eagle pins (Mom, Dad, Mentor(s), Eagle) out of package and lay out on Eagle pin table, American Flag (rear of hall), Troop Flag (rear of hall), flag stands (front of hall), AV projector, tables (refreshments tables, Eagle pins table at front, memorabilia table off to the side, AV table), projector screen (if needed),

Place reserved signs for Eagle Scout's immediate family seating at front.
