Assume that we are alive. Actually here.


Assume that the world is real.

- a. If so, then there are two types of truth:
 - i. Special Revelation or Scripture
 - ii. General Revelation or Nature
- b. Assume there is a disconnect between our interpretation of General Revelation called science and our interpretation of Special Revelation called doctrine or theology.
- c. Luckily, there are 3 models that try and solve this problem: Young Earth Creationism, Old Earth Creationism, & Theistic Evolution.

Who's interpretation are you going to trust? Science is always changing, so don't build your life on it. Think about the index of refraction, there are different mediums that bend light by a different amounts. Which is more bent? Our science or our theology?



Well, obviously, this graph should be flipped. Our doctrine is more bent. We've had some crazy beliefs in the past... like Flat Earth, Ecclesiastes in the Middle Ages, etc Flat Earth is not a viable belief. Creation.com refutes Flat Earth because all the verses used by Flat Earthers fall into 3 camps: Non-Secular, ambiguous, or misreading of English words. (https://creation.com/refuting-flat-earth).

But, you read the Bible the same way? Yeah, I'm a concordist. Sidebar. What is a concordist? I'm not a concordist! We solve the problem by not taking the words literally in the first parts of Genesis. We start with the natural world around us, and don't translate "day" literally to 24 hour days, and have these creation events where God creates fish and birds and trilobites... and they all die out, So God creates again. Isn't that wasteful? How powerful is your God? You gotta look at the "big picture." Hmm... That's not really satisfactory.

What about the death? Didn't Adam's sin incur physical death? (Like it says in the Wheaton College Statement of faith?)

WE BELIEVE that God directly created Adam and Eve, the historical parents of the entire human race; and that they were created in His own image, distinct from all other living creatures, and in a state of original righteousness.

WE BELIEVE that our first parents sinned by rebelling against God's revealed will and thereby incurred both physical and spiritual death, and that as a result all human beings are born with a sinful nature that leads them to sin in thought, word, and deed.

The same sin that incurred physical and spiritual death, which is the reason Jesus died for sinners? Those are humans. +Weren't the animals vegetarian because eating meat was given after sin to animals and to humans after Noah? Umm... You got me there... Doesn't God hate death? There's

no death in heaven... "The last enemy to be destroyed is death." Restored creation? What needs to be restored? Lion lie down with the lamb? Etc...

Orange, why don't you agree with Modern Science? Because Evolution is false. Amen! Well, at least we have the same interpretive framework. I'm not sure I like your interpretive framework... We'll talk. Anyways, we solve the problem by reading Genesis non-literally because we are non-concordists. Our doctrine matches the scientific world around us. Does it though? What about the logical inconsistency? In your model, you have a continuous line of animals. A single cell that you set up natural laws in the universe to become multiple cells, that become trilobites, then fish, then tetrapods and dinosaurs, then mammals, monkeys, hominids, and now us. Adam's father was sinless, yet he died. (If you have a real, legitimate Adam). Adam sinned, and he also died. How can you have a legitimate "literal" Adam and Eve? Tim Keller does. Timmy K is confused! I'm all for science and stuff, but the Creation events still match that God creates Adam and Eve out of dust, just like He created all the different animals. Same method of creation (with the added element of breathing in life to Adam and Eve). Logical inconsistency? At least my theology is consistent. I read Genesis the same way I read the rest of my Bible. I do too! I do too! No you don't.

I read Genesis as a historical account because "Toledoth" is a word that means "Historical Account" and is used to start the story of Abram, Story of Isaac, Story of Jacob and Esau... Because it's history, that forces it to be scientific because science is trying to reconstruct "What happened?" and History is an answer to "what happened." Nah, an event can divorce science and history. Huh?

If this were design, its sloppiness and inefficiency suggested gross incompetence; and if this were benevolence, the designer exercised it with a paradoxical delight in suffering... Morevor, the wastefulness and suffering entailed in evolution made it harder to believe that God could be responsible for the process." (page 183).



Why did Jesus have to die in the flesh for our sins? "Wages of sin is death?" in Romans?


That death seems pretty physical to me...



The cow will feed with the bear, their young will lie down together, and the lion will eat straw like the ox. The infant will play near the cobra's den and the young child will put its hand into the viper's nest. They will neither harm nor destroy on all my holy

mountain, for the earth will be filled in the knowledge of the LORD as the waters cover the sea."

Lions eating straw like oxen? Seems like a vegetable to me. So when you say "didn't plants die before sin?" I say yes, because plants aren't biblically "alive". They don't have the breath of life "nephesh." Obviously this passage is metaphorical. Ditto. Why is a lion eating something a lion NEVER ate to begin with?



Uncategorized, Other Questions, Things to Think about.

- 1. What exactly is the evidence for no (animal) death before the fall? Is Romans even talking about that?
- 2. So, what I'm hearing you say is that science is wrong, because I have a prior claim to scripture? Yup. So, science is wrongly, misguided, fundamentally misunderstood, natural processes, are just wrong?
 - a. Young Earth, maybe not deceptive, but a testing of our faith?
 - b. Andromeda Galaxy is far away... 2000 light years away and it's the closest galaxy out there... So, lots of different rates for the speed of light, because the 6,000 years don't change and the distances are different.
- 3. Why is Origins so important? To you?' and a follow-up, is Origins [or any secondary issue] that important to Jesus? Does he really care?
 - a. Origins... Obstacle to people's faith... There are other (more important) obstacles. What proportion should this issue be? Blown out of proportion. Cornerstone that you build the rest of your faith on.
 - b. Build you faith on something different than origins, like the historicity of the resurrection, or a personal experience with Jesus or something like that. If that's true, then the Bible is true. If you start with Jesus you can work your way back to Genesis which is at the end.
