## • Collective Action Update - SUP Reduction Actions (Susan Richman)

- Many Ten Town Action members have communicated with their local grocery stores; collecting petitions; ultimate goal to meet with grocery chain CEOs and legislators
- Lucius Parshall has a bill to study waste reduction options like the plastic bag action
  - Lack of enabling legislation that allows towns to regulate waste is a challenge
  - Can PWG collect data on film & foam (?) diversion
- Focus on economics and diversion data EX: Jaffrey has diverted thousands of pounds of plastic film, this can be used as a strategy to justify eliminating bags and foam packaging
- Outreach to DES for data on waste diversion measures
- Institutions & governments are voluntarily managing purchasing policies (MA state agencies)
- ACTION: (WHO?) Write an article, make presentations in collaboration with NHMA
- Municipalities make money on recycling (Peterborough/Jaffrey/Harrisville/Walpole) with Ben Hoy, former employee of NRRA; but do others know how to do this? Markets for recycling streams are volatile
- Towns can make resolutions (Durham is working on plastic water bottle reduction)
- PFAS bill to take effect in 2027
- From Bonnie Christie, Hopkinton: "Yes, our numbers have been going in the wrong direction. Every year our TS manager prints how many pounds of recycling we take in and weight of trash going out to landfill. Every year our waste tonnage grows and the percentage of total waste recycled shrinks."

Mary - Harrisville: working on food scraps and zero waste proclamation; recruited Tim Jenkins

Tim - Peterborough: learning from the group

**Kristine - Dover:** Co-chair of Dover Plastics Reduction group; co-leads Reusable Seacoast pilot; report & recommendations pending; health impacts of plastics; Green Tips coming back; will join petition collective action for SUP reduction

**Peggy - Jaffrey:** film recycling at transfer station; wants to connect with larger effort; working on petition (250 signatures)

Patsy - Nelson: attended tabling events on home energy coaching effort

Mary/Susan - Harrisville: Had a table at the Harrisville Energy fair (HeatSmart+ Kickoff) on Sat 1/25 for Rethink Plastic Team. Spoke to a select board person at the fair. Came up with a plan to possibly have the town help us in our Foam Drive. I will be writing up a proposal to present later in March (after town meeting) Submitted my 18th article to our town's community newsletter. Signed up to volunteer at our Recycle Center once a month, starting in Feb.

**Ann - Chester:** recruited a new PWG member; working on grocery store SUP reduction; environmental justice focus on lead; Manchester water treatment plant is burning PFAS impacting air, land, water; PFAS campaign to pass bills to prevent this

**Peggy - Sandwich:** continuing with EPS and film collections; working with energy group (button up, solar warrant article)

**Carol - Center Harbor:** working with school library (serves Meredith, Center Harbor, etc) to focus on plastics reduction efforts

**Cynthia - Dover:** Co-chairs plastic reduction group; toxic chemical focus, specifically synthetic turf; will coach people on school reuse projects

**Bruce - Keene:** likes to attend meetings to learn more about plastics recycling;

**Kathy, Peterborough - Re**cycling Advisory Committee, styro collection gathered 14 bags to Gilford, tabled in Harrisville and Peterborough on plastics reduction

plastic reduction and use to influence shareholders; try to harness shareholder power to
change companies

#### Fossil Fuel Investments Webinar

- 99% of Americans are forced to invest in fossil fuels in their retirement plans.
- Almost 20% of investments in fossil fuels come from retirement savings.
- If you took 12 companies including Adobe, Amazon, Apple, Google, Intuit, Meta, Microsoft, Netflix, Oracle, etc: the employees have lost \$5.1 billion due to their companies investing in fossil fuels.
- o If you took \$10,000 and invested in fossil fuels 10 years ago, guess how much money you'd have today? \$10,004.
- If you took the \$10,000 and invested in the S&P 500 minus the fossil fuels, you'd have \$34,851!
- Google has invested \$1.7 billion in fossil fuels through their retirement savings. If they hadn't done that it would be like taking 700,000 cars off the road.
- An explanation of why fossil fuel companies are desperate to turn to plastics.
