You may have seen the government's announcement this week of a further \$160m worth of funding being directed to building new classrooms and schools in Selwyn. While we are thrilled to see this commitment to funding, we are concerned that West Melton School has not been considered in these decisions. As a Board, we had already begun to actively engage with the Ministry of Education, our local MP and Council prior to this announcement and we will continue to press for consideration to future growth impacts and needs for our school and campus.

This year is election year for the Board, and we encourage anyone considering putting their name forward to join us on 16 June to learn more about this opportunity (full details are below).

Winter is a very busy time of year, particularly with sports and many will be eagerly anticipating the opening of the ski fields in a few weeks. Stay safe and well.

Property update - exciting new project underway

Our much anticipated upgrade to the school bike track is now a reality, with some very excited ākonga now eagerly awaiting the arrival of the machinery around September. There is still a bit of work to be done before we can get underway but we're excited to share the plan with you now.

We have engaged expert track construction - Cam Bisset of Dirt Trailbuilding.

The total project is estimated to cost around \$130K + GST, with the Board committing to underwrite the remaining costs after considering the funds raised at the Fete. This ensures that we can move forward with this exciting initiative. However, we're also eager to minimise the financial burden on the school, so this is where the support of our local community and businesses can play a crucial role

The track will provide a fantastic space for learners, families, and the wider community to enjoy outdoor fun, promote physical activity, and bring people together.
