1. Welcome & Host Kick-Off - City of Duluth

- Ryan Granlund shared a unique illicit discharge recent experience. He said it was one of the hardest in his experience and welcomed comments and questions.
- Grant street Congdon Park neighborhood illicit discharge
- August 2021- received call sewage smell from garden. Investigating found sewer pipe culvert
 previously unknown now added to GIS, draining into a rain garden with sewage. Where is it
 coming from?
- Catch basin found on neighbor's property across street, going under road. Dye tested homes and never saw dye come out to the storm sewer. Tried to back it up and pressure it. Not sure where sewage is coming from. Dye tested multiple times. Tried smoke testing. No connections found. Found house built directly on top of a storm sewer. Hard to plug the storm pipe- not work well. 1926 pipe.
- Televised sanitary sewers. Found water coming in from a pvc pipe/mesh and concrete patch. Found a plug and hole in a sanitary sewer line over 500 feet away that had migrated through the soil to the and granular backfill on outside of sanitary sewer until it found the mesh patch. All sealed and fixed now. Took 8 days!


3. Executive Chair Update - Ryan
