- 150–250 words.
- One paragraph only.
- No citations, tables, figures, or equations.
- Include 3–5 keywords.

Recommended Structure:

1. Background of the study.
2. Research objective.
3. Research method.
4. Main findings.
5. Conclusion and implication.

INTRODUCTION

(Book Antiqua, Font Size 12 pt, spacing before 0, after 0)

The introduction should explain the research problem, significance of the study, theoretical background, research gap, novelty, and objectives.

The Introduction should contain:

1. Background and current issues.
2. Relevant literature and previous studies.
3. Research gap.
4. Novelty of the study.
5. Research objectives.

Recommended Composition:

- Background and problem: 40%
- Literature review and gap: 40%

- Novelty and objective: 20%

Requirements:

- Use recent references (last 5 years).
- Include international references.
- Clearly identify the contribution of the study.

LITERATURE REVIEW

This section presents theories, concepts, and empirical studies related to the research topic.

The Literature Review should:

- Discuss key concepts and variables.
- Present previous research findings.
- Explain theoretical foundations.
- Develop a conceptual framework or research model.

Requirements:

- Use primary references from scholarly journals.
- Focus on relevant and recent literature.
- Avoid merely listing theories without critical analysis.

METHOD

The method section should provide sufficient detail to allow replication of the study.

Include the following components:

Research Design

Describe the research approach and design.

Participants or Subjects

Explain population, sample, participants, and sampling techniques.

Instruments

Describe instruments used and evidence of validity and reliability.

Data Collection Procedures

Explain how data were collected.

Data Analysis

Describe statistical or qualitative analysis techniques used.

Requirements:

- Explain ethical considerations if applicable.
- Include validity and reliability information.
- Mention software used for data analysis.

This section may be divided into subheadings. It should provide a concise and precise description of the experimental results, their interpretation, and the experimental conclusions that can be drawn.

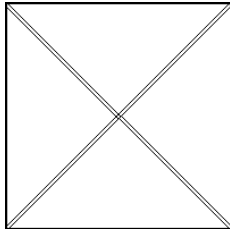

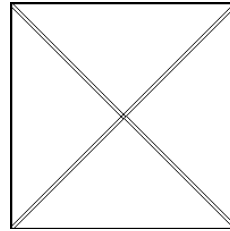

Start the quotation on a new line, with the entire quote indented from the left margin. Only indent the first line of the quotation by an additional quarter inch if you are citing multiple paragraphs. Your parenthetical citation should come after the closing punctuation mark. (Book Antiqua , 12 pt, one line spacing)

Discussion

Discuss and interpret the findings in relation to theories and previous studies.

The Discussion should:

- 1. Explain the meaning of findings.
- 2. Compare findings with previous studies.
- 3. Explain similarities and differences.
- 4. Highlight theoretical and practical implications.
- 5. Explain research limitations.

Requirements:

- Do not merely repeat results.
- Demonstrate the contribution of the study.
- Emphasize novelty and significance.

CONCLUSION

The conclusion should summarise the main state of play at the point of writing and consider the next steps. Summarise and conclude, restating the main argument and presenting key conclusions and recommendations—state how your findings/new framework can be applied in practice. Explain what the implications are for further research.

REFERENCES

References should relate only to the material you cited within your article (this is not a bibliography). References should be in APA Style 7th Edition and listed in alphabetical order. Write several references that are cited and really written/quoted in the text from primary sources (80% taken from scholarly journals, 20% other supporting sources). Please do not include any abbreviations. Any additional references should be included in an Additional Reading section.
