Objective of Module To develop trainees' professional competencies in performing duty at external posts of secured facilities and ensuring the safe escorting of prisoners through prompt response to emergency events and the expert use of weapons and special equipment in accordance with current legislation.

Implements security measures for protected facilities, considering the specifics of duty at external posts in accordance with current legislation.	Adheres to post-relief and turnover algorithms and ensures the security of the assigned facility Implements measures for the safe movement and escorting of prisoners during various types of convoying. Analyzes changes in the operational environment and implements tactical action algorithms in routine and emergency situations. Timely detects signs of escape preparation, assault, or unauthorized approach to the protected facility. Promptly provides established alarm signals and effectively executes the sequence of actions according to the scenario.	Assessment Method: Complex situational task "Guard Shift" based on a scenario card (practical simulation exam at the training facility). The trainee performs a complete sequence of actions for post-relief and duty performance at various facilities (tower, patrolling, medical facility, or checkpoint), demonstrating the ability to ensure the security regime and promptly respond to changes in the operational environment according to a given scenario. Threshold criteria: – Adheres to the full verification algorithm during post-relief/turnover (communication, engineering barriers, technical security equipment, special gear, documentation), considering the specific nature of the facility. – Conducts proper information exchange regarding the operational environment at the assigned facility during the relief of guards. – Responds timely and adequately to changes in the operational environment or a control threat, applying established tactical techniques and alarm signals. – Avoids critical violations of safety measures and rules for handling weapons and special equipment. – Does not commit critical errors that could lead to a breach of the facility's security or the unlawful use of force/weapons.

Implements measures for the safe movement and escorting of prisoners during counter, scheduled, and emergency conveying.	Performs the prisoner turnover and transfer procedure during conveying, including conducting searches and monitoring the placement of individuals in a special vehicle. Ensures reliable isolation of prisoners and security along movement routes and at exchange points. Responds to complications in the operational environment during transit (escape attempt, assault, deterioration of a prisoner's health) by providing established signals and acting in accordance with security protocols.	Assessment Method: Simulation of a full escort cycle based on a scenario card (practical exam at the training facility). The trainee performs a range of actions at a simulated exchange point and a special vehicle mock-up, demonstrating the ability to safely receive, move, and transfer prisoners, as well as respond to emergency events. Threshold criteria: – Adheres to the regulation for the turnover and transfer of prisoners. – Ensures correct boarding and placement of individuals in the special vehicle, maintaining constant supervision of their behavior. – Follows tactical techniques for securing and isolating prisoners from unauthorized persons during transit and at exchange points. – Timely identifies threats (escape attempt, assault, change in health status) and provides established alarm signals. – Executes the action algorithm for complications in the operational environment, applying special equipment or weapons according to security protocols and current legislation. – Avoids critical errors that could lead to a prisoner escape, an assault on the convoy, or a violation of safe weapon handling rules.

Independent work in the module (objective, topic, assessment if necessary)	Independent Study Topics: – Analysis of Regulatory Framework for Post Duty: Independent study and note-taking on the key requirements of the Instruction on the Organization of Security in Correctional Institutions. – Study of Access Control Regulations for Road and Rail Transport: Examination of checkpoint procedures and rules for verifying shipping documentation for cargo. – Detailed Review of Action Protocols for Operational Complications: Analysis of procedures for escape attempts, assaults on convoys, or sudden deterioration of a prisoner's health. Study of alarm signaling algorithms and the procedure for using special equipment and weapons for each emergency scenario.		
Formation of module grade	Module assessment is conducted on a "Pass/Fail" basis. A passing grade for the module is awarded upon the successful completion of the complex situational task "Guard Shift" based on a scenario card (a practical simulation exam at the training facility) and achieving a minimum score of 80 points in the simulation of a full escort cycle based on a scenario card.
