This assignment outlines creating an infographic in groups to showcase key aspects of a specific unit in AP Art History using Adobe Elements. Here's a breakdown:

Group Work:

- Groups are assigned 1 unit (2-3 sections per person) from the AP Art History curriculum.
- Create a Google Doc shared within the group to brainstorm and develop content.

Content Requirements:

- **Tagline:** Develop a short (7-word) phrase capturing the unit's (and sections) main idea.
- **Overarching Facts:** Identify 3 key facts for each assigned unit section.
 - These could be historical events, artistic movements, techniques, or dating methods for artifacts.
- **Highlight key Vocabulary:** Make these words visually stand out (both in google doc and Infographic)
- **Required Works (10-15):** Select impactful works from the unit, and evenly distribute between the sections within the unit
 - Include an Image and details for each work: title, artist/culture, year, and media.
 - Highlight the most unique aspect of each work (not a repeat of overarching facts).

Infographic Design (using [Adobe Elements Template](#)):

- **Color Story:** Base the color scheme on the texts in the AP Art History Review Document.
- **Primary Fonts:** Choose *readable* fonts that reflect the unit's aesthetics.
- **Layout:** Maintain a consistent layout across all infographics (shapes, secondary fonts) for a unified look. Customize text size and positioning as needed.
- **Images:** Keep background image black and white but change to reflect the unit's theme; should not overpower or distract from main content.

Submission:

- Link Group Google Doc to [AP Art History Review Document](#) (make sure it's viewable by everyone)
- Save your infographic as a PDF and upload it to the AP Art History Review Document too.
- Use each other's infographics for studying for the Midterm and AP Art History Exam.

Grading Rubric:

- Accuracy of information - information is simplified and reliable
- Clarity of presentation - how easy it the information read (both artistically and academically)
- Visual appeal - does everything look mindfully placed and organized visually
- Creativity - how your team collaborates and consolidates workflow; how uniquely the requirements are met;
