

What are NFTs?

- Non-fungible token
- It's unique and can't be replaced with something else
- For example, a bitcoin is fungible — trade one for another bitcoin, and you'll have exactly the same thing
- “Fine art meets trading cards”
 - Could be one (e.g. Van Gogh) or could be many (e.g. pokemon cards)

How does it work?

- Most NFTs are part of the Ethereum blockchain.
- Ethereum is a cryptocurrency, like bitcoin or dogecoin, but its blockchain also supports these NFTs, which store extra information that makes them work differently from, say, an ETH coin
- You can copy a digital file as many times as you want, including the art that's included with an NFT. But NFTs are designed to give you something that can't be copied: ownership of the work (though the artist can still retain the copyright and reproduction rights, just like with physical artwork)
- NFT marketplaces: OpenSea, Rarible, and Grimes' choice, Nifty Gateway, but there are plenty of others.
- Anyone can sell an NFT, and they could ask for whatever currency (including crypto) they want.
- NFTs are stored in NFT-compatible digital wallets

How are NFTs used?

- NFTs can really be anything digital
- An evolution of fine art collecting, only with digital art
- People have long built communities based on things they own, and now it's happening with NFTs

Who benefits from NFTs?

- Artists:
 - Gives them a way to sell work that there otherwise might not be much of a market for
 - NFTs have a feature that you can enable that will pay you a percentage every time the NFT is sold or changes hands, making sure that if your work gets super popular and balloons in value, you'll see some of that benefit
- Buyers:
 - “Charity” - supporting artists
 - Basic usage rights, like being able to post the image online or set it as your profile picture
 - Bragging rights
- Collectors:
 - Can buy it and hope that the value of it goes up one day, so you can sell it for a profit

Popularity:

- Marvel, Wayne Gretzky
- Nike has patented a method to verify sneakers' authenticity using an NFT system, which it calls CryptoKicks
- There are already games that let you have NFTs as items. One even sells virtual plots of land as NFTs.
- NFT rocks
- A TV show called Stoner Cats which uses NFTs as a sort of ticket system. Require that NFT to watch the show!
- NFTs associated with TV shows.

Cons:

- Global warming: NFTs use up more electricity (blockchain-based)
 - Ethereum is working on cutting greenhouse gas emissions ([Source](#))

Social Impact:

- WheelzUP mission-based NFTs is a launchpad for new ideas and innovators in the area of social good and what can be accomplished in this area ([Source](#))
- Fundraising for non-profit organisations and charities
 - A non-profit organization called "Leyline" raised \$60,000 by gathering artists and developers to sell NFTs to help children suffering from cancer get medical supplies.
- Museums selling digital assets
- NFTs can provide a type of rewarding system for volunteering activities like cleaning polluted beaches, parks, or lands.
 - A German project called CleanOcean is a frictionless decentralized yield-generation charity eco-token
- DinoMonks, The First NFT Project Focused Solely On Mental Health And Wellness, Featuring Founder Roman Tirone

 - In July, the Florida chimpanzee refuge Save the Chimps made NFTs from finger paintings done by three of its residents and listed them for auction.
 - Didn't gain much traction but attracted first-time donors
