## Republican Navy Act

- 1. The Republican Navy of England is created, and acknowledged as the most critical of the two military branches
  - a. The position of Republican Admiral is created
    - i. The position of Republican Admiral may only be assigned to an individual appointed by the Ministry and confirmed by a majority vote of the Senate
    - ii. Each Republican Admiral may control up to 3 naval units. A unit may be controlled by only one Republican Admiral at a time.
    - iii. When a naval unit is produced, purchased, or received, it is immediately put under the control of a Republican Admiral who has control over fewer than 3 units, if such a Republican Admiral exists.
      - If there are multiple Republican Admirals who each have control over fewer than 3 units, the unit is put under the control of the Republican Admiral who has held this position for the longest time.
    - iv. Any Republican Admiral may be removed from this position by a majority vote of the Senate
  - b. The position of Grand Admiral is created
    - i. The position of Grand Admiral may only be assigned to an individual appointed by the Ministry and confirmed by a 2/3rds vote of the Senate
    - ii. Each Grand Admiral may control up to 10 naval units
    - iii. A Grand Admiral may take immediate control of any naval units that are deployed, provided that they aren't under the command of a different Grand Admiral or part of the Expeditionary Forces
      - 1. If the Grand Admiral takes control of a naval unit which was under the control of a Republican Admiral, the Republican Admiral loses control of said unit.
      - A Grand Admiral may temporarily take control of Expeditionary
        Forces units when it is necessary to ensure the safety of English
        cities due to a direct military threat. The Grand Admiral must
        relinquish control of these units as soon as the threat is no longer
        present.
    - iv. Grand Admirals may issue orders to Republican Admirals
      - 1. If there are multiple Grand Admirals, such an order is only issued when a majority of Grand Admirals agrees to it
    - v. Any Grand Admiral may be removed from this position by a 2/3rds vote of the Senate
  - c. The Republican Navy will be used to protect English trade and strategic interests

- i. The Republican Navy is placed in charge of defending English trade
- d. Republican Navy Dockyards
  - i. The "Royal Navy Dockyard" district must now be referred to as the Republican Navy Dockyard.
  - ii. The Republican Navy Dockyard must be built as the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd district in any city which has a valid spot.
    - 1. A lake not connectable to the ocean does not count as a valid spot for the implementation of this rule
    - 2. The Senate may exempt a city from this rule by a majority vote
- e. Technologies of the Navy
  - Any naval technology with a eureka must be researched as the 1st, 2nd, or 3rd technology after unlocking it in the tech tree
    - 1. A naval technology is any technology which enables a new naval unit, naval district, naval building, or increases naval movement
- f. Monuments of the Navy
  - Governors are encouraged to construct any World Wonders which increase the Republican Navy's ability to move, or enhance its combat ability, and the Ministry is encouraged to approve construction of such World Wonders.

## 2. Expeditionary Forces

- a. Expeditionary Forces shall be used for the purposes of exploration in order to:
  - i. Identify lands for settlement
  - ii. Encounter City-states and foreign nations for the purposes of trade and diplomacy.
  - iii. Map out traversable naval routes to coastal City-states and cities of foreign nations for the purposes of trade.
- b. The first two naval units produced shall be classified as Expeditionary Forces.
  - i. For the purposes of Law, Expeditionary Forces units are considered to be units of the Recon class in addition to their ordinary unit class.
  - ii. When an Expeditionary Forces unit is destroyed, another naval unit shall become part of the Expeditionary Forces.
    - 1. This may remove a unit from the control of a Republican Admiral.
    - If there aren't any units available to become Expeditionary Forces, the next naval unit produced, purchased, or received shall be classified as an Expeditionary Forces unit to replace the destroyed one.
      - a. This takes priority over assigning these units to Republican Admirals as described in Article 1.a.iii.
- c. The position of Expeditionary Admiral is created

- The position of Expeditionary Admiral may only be assigned to an individual appointed by the Ministry and confirmed by a majority vote of the Senate
- ii. Only one person may hold the Expeditionary Admiral position at any time
- iii. The Expeditionary Admiral has control over all Expeditionary Forces units
- iv. The Expeditionary Admiral may be removed from this position by a majority vote of the Senate
- 3. This law overrides all previous laws concerning the organization, deployment, and makeup of the naval forces
