Students planning to enter Harding's Pharmacy program may apply to enter the program prior to completing a bachelor's degree. However, the remaining hours listed below will need to be completed as part of the PHARMD program's admissions prerequisite requirements. A minimum of 64 semester hours of undergraduate coursework must be completed prior to enrolling in graduate level courses. A minimum of 72 semester hours of undergraduate coursework is required prior to federal financial aid eligibility at the graduate level. Students who plan to enter the Pharmacy program early may or may not be required to complete the remaining Liberal Arts courses listed above. That determination depends on if the student is degree seeking and/or enrolled in at least eight hours of undergraduate credit at Harding.

**NOTE** – All undergraduate degree programs at Harding University require a minimum of 120 cumulative hours. Some majors require more. Please contact Harding's Articulation Coordinator for additional information related to your four-year degree plans.

**NOTE** – In order to graduate with a bachelor's degree, students are required to complete a minimum of 42 hours from Harding courses numbered 3000-4999.

**NOTE** – Both MATH 150 and 160 must be completed in order to transfer the coursework for MATH 2350. A minimum grade of a "C" is required for further studies in mathematics and sciences.

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**NOTE** – Both BIOL 110 and 120 must be completed in order for these courses to satisfy the BIOL 1500/1500L requirement for Health Science and Pre-Pharmacy majors. These courses will not automatically satisfy the BIOL 1500/1500L requirement for any other program of study at Harding. Substitutions outside of the Health Science and Pre-Pharmacy programs will be considered on a study-by-student basis.
