Lesson Ideas

Lesson Title

After School Storytime

Duration

1 Hour

Lesson Plan

1. **Welcome and Introduction** (5 minutes)
 - Greet students warmly and explain the objectives of After School Storytime.
2. **Vocabulary Builder** (10 minutes)
 - Introduce a list of 5 to 7 new words from the story to be read.
 - Discuss each word's meaning and use it in a sentence.
3. **Read-Aloud and Listening Activity** (15 minutes)
 - Read a culturally diverse story to the students.

GRASSHOPPER

- Encourage students to listen attentively as you read.

4. **Discussion and Language Skills** (10 minutes)

- Ask questions about the story to promote language skills.
- Discuss the characters, setting, and main events.
- Encourage students to share their thoughts and opinions.

5. **Cultural Appreciation Activity** (10 minutes)

- Highlight an aspect of the culture represented in the story.
- Show pictures or artifacts related to the culture for a visual understanding.

6. **Mindfulness Exercise** (5 minutes)

- Guide students through a short mindfulness exercise (e.g., deep breathing or visualization related to the story).

7. **Reflective Journaling** (5 minutes)

- Provide time for students to write or draw their favorite part of the story in a journal.

Materials List

- Storybook featuring a culturally diverse story
- Vocabulary cards or list
- Pictures or artifacts related to the story's culture
- Journals or paper for reflective journaling
- Pens or crayons

Adaptations for Different Ages

- **Younger Kids:** Read a simpler story with engaging illustrations. Use more visual aids and shorter mindfulness exercises.
- **Older Kids:** Choose a more complex story with deeper themes. Encourage deeper discussion and longer journaling time.

Movement Break

- Five minutes of gentle stretching and movement related to the story's theme. For example, if the story is about a journey, mimic walking or marching movements.

Bonus Activities

GRASSHOPPER

- **Cultural Craft:** Make a simple craft related to the culture in the story, such as creating a paper lantern or drawing traditional clothing.
- **Story Creation:** Collaboratively create a short story using the new vocabulary words introduced. Have students illustrate their story collectively.

Series Outline

- Week 1: Vocabulary Builder**
 - Introduce a "Word of the Week" and create a story together using the new word.
 - Organize a fun word scavenger hunt where kids find objects representing specific vocabulary.
 - Play a vocabulary charades game to encourage active use of new words.
- Week 2: Language Skills**
 - Conduct a storytelling relay where each child adds a sentence in sequence.
 - Use wordless picture books and have kids narrate their version of the story.
 - Create language-based puzzles and games like crosswords or fill-in-the-blanks.
- Week 3: Listening Skills**
 - Read a story aloud and follow up with comprehension questions.
 - Play "Telephone" using complex sentences and see how the message changes.
 - Organize a "Sound Detectives" game where kids identify sounds from the story.
- Week 4: Cultural Appreciation**
 - Explore stories and folktales from around the world and discuss different cultures.
 - Craft cultural symbols or artifacts related to the stories read.
 - Invite a guest speaker to share traditional stories from their culture.
- Week 5: Creative Writing**
 - Have kids write their own short stories, starting with a predetermined sentence.
 - Create a "Story Dice" activity where dice rolled determine story elements.
 - Host a mini writing workshop focusing on character and plot development.
- Week 6: Mindfulness through Stories**
 - Read a calming story and lead a guided meditation session based on its themes.
 - Introduce breathing exercises using story elements to guide visualization.

GRASSHOPPER

- Write and share gratitude letters or journals inspired by story events.

7. ****Week 7: Time Away from Screens****

- Encourage kids to illustrate a scene they've imagined from a story.
- Organize outdoor storytelling sessions (weather permitting).
- Engage in a group storytelling by the campfire (real or digital).

8. ****Week 8: Storytelling through Art****

- Have children create comic strips from their favorite story.
- Introduce clay modeling to recreate story characters or scenes.
- Design story character masks and have a role-playing session.

9. ****Week 9: Story Elements & Structure****

- Break down a story into its elements (beginning, middle, end) and discuss.
- Play a "Plot Twist" game where kids change a story's ending.
- Create a storyboard or mind map of a story structure.

10. ****Week 10: Story Celebration & Sharing****

- Organize an "Author's Corner" where kids share their written or drawn stories.
- Compile a class book of short stories created during the series.
- Have a story-themed party with costumes and snacks inspired by the stories read.
