It's a call to recognize that our struggles may be redirecting us towards God's greater purpose, reminding us that we often 'stumble into blessings' orchestrated by divine wisdom.

Title: Leave That Alone: Discerning God's Purpose in the Battle

Sermon Summary: This sermon explores the importance of discernment and prioritizing God's purpose over our immediate circumstances. The pastor emphasizes that even in the midst of spiritual battles, believers must learn to recognize and preserve the resources God has provided for their sustenance.
