- 1. What is the most important dinner invitation you have ever received?
- 2. Read 2 Samuel 4:4. Mephibosheth's name means "out of the mouth of shame." What is shame and why is it such a powerful dynamic?
- 3. Read 2 Samuel 9:1-4. "Lo Debar" means a place of no pasture, no rest, no meaning, or simply a place of nothingness. It is similar to our term "the Badlands." Have you ever lived in Lo Debar, or the Badlands? How would you describe it?
- 4. What part of your past or your life leaves you feeling unworthy or ashamed? Try to be honest and vulnerable if you can.
- 5. Read 2 Samuel 9:5-13. What is special about the "kindness" that David shows?
- 6. How is the imagery of the table important to us today as followers of Jesus?
- 7. What makes it hard for you to accept God's kindness and grace?
- 8. In what ways do you feel like you have been "carried to the table"?
- 9. What part of Mephibosheth's story connected with you? What do you feel like God is trying to say to you through this story?
