Prayers for the Candidates (kneel or sit)

The celebrant then says to the congregation,

L: Let us now pray for those who are to receive the sacrament of new birth.

A person appointed leads the following litany.

A: Lord, hear our prayer.

L: Fill them with your holy and life-giving Spirit.

The leader concludes.

L: Grant, O Lord, that all who are baptized into the death of Jesus Christ your Son may live in the power of his resurrection and look for him to come again in glory; who lives and reigns now and for ever.

The Celebration of Baptism (Family comes forward)

L: The Lord be with you

A: And also with you.

L: Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

A: It is right to give our thanks and praise.

L: We thank you, Almighty God, for the gift of water. Over water the Holy Spirit moved in the beginning of creation. Through water you led the children of Israel out of their bondage in Egypt into the land of promise. In water your Son Jesus received the baptism of John and was anointed by the Holy Spirit as the Messiah, the Christ, to lead us, through his death and resurrection, from the bondage of sin into everlasting life.

We thank you, Father, for the water of baptism. In it we are buried with Christ in his death. By it we share in his resurrection. Through it we are reborn by the Holy Spirit. Therefore in joyful obedience to your Son, we bring into his fellowship those who come to him in faith, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Now sanctify this water by the power of your Holy Spirit, that those who are here cleansed from sin and born again, may continue for ever in the risen life of Jesus Christ our Saviour. To him, to you, and to the Holy Spirit, be all honour and glory, now and for ever. Amen.

Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The Baptismal Covenant

L: Do you believe in God the Father?

A: I believe in God, The Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

L: Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

A: I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.
He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary. He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried. He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again. He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father. He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

L: Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

A: I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting.

- L: Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship, in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?
- A: I will, with God's help.
- L: Will you persevere in resisting evil and, whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

The Baptism (Please be seated)

Each person is presented by name to the celebrant, who then pours water upon the candidates, saying.

L: Aiko Maya Paul, Claire Enisse Mathieson and Aurora Rose Marie Moore, I baptize you in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

The celebrant makes the sign of the cross on the forehead of each one saying to each.

L: I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The celebrant, in the full sight of the congregation, prays over the newly baptized, saying,

L: Heavenly Father, we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit you have bestowed upon these your servants the forgiveness of sin, and have raised them to the new life of grace. Sustain them, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give them an inquiring and discerning heart, the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you, and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works. Amen

The Giving of the Light - To each of the newly baptized a lighted candle is given L: Receive the light of Christ, to show that you have passed from

darkness to light.

- A: Let your light so shine before others that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.
- L: Let us welcome the newly baptized.
- A: We receive you into the household of God.

  Confess the faith of Christ crucified, proclaim his resurrection, and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

L: It is indeed right that we should praise you, gracious God, for you created all things. You formed us in your own image: male and female you created us. When we turned away from you in sin, you did not cease to care for us, but opened a path of salvation for all people.

You made a covenant with Israel, and through your servants Abraham and Sarah gave the promise of a blessing to all nations. Through Moses you led your people from bondage into freedom; through the prophets you renewed your promise of salvation. Therefore, with them, and with all your saints who have served you in every age, we give thanks and raise our voices to proclaim the glory of your name.


