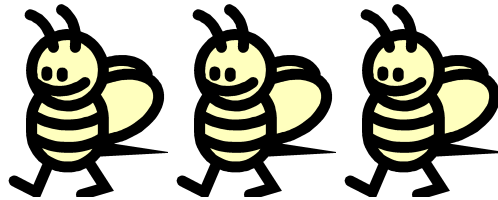

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Mission Statement

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool is based on Christian values, and serves young children as they grow and develop. We provide an environment in which children are guided with love and compassion and are offered numerous learning opportunities through intentional play. We embrace and respect every child for his or her unique qualities and promote the individual growth and success of each child.

Philosophy of Sandia Presbyterian Preschool

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool is a preschool based on Christian values and is committed to providing developmentally appropriate, faith-based educational opportunities for the development and growth of the whole child.

We believe that children should be nurtured, respected for their own individuality, and to grow at their own rate. We embrace every child's individual needs and provide opportunities through which each child can experience success. We believe that every child and their family deserve equitable access to appropriate accommodations, modifications, services and supports that acknowledge their uniqueness and enable them to reach their full potential.

We embrace diversity and believe that it enriches our culture and social experience. We encourage the exploration and expression of each child's identity, interests and celebrate differences. It is our hope to create a strong sense of belonging and acceptance of individual identities and cultures and that through such an environment, our children will develop a strong sense of self which will promote future success and unity.

We provide an environment that allows such experiences to take place through developmentally appropriate "interest centers", offering opportunities at play, make-believe, interactions with others, experimentation, exploration and manipulation of real-life objects, use of all senses, and hands-on experiences.

We facilitate a development of trust, empathy, and accountability, through positive connection with teachers and peers, observation of positive role modeling, and teacher-family relationships. Therefore, we are committed to

valuing and embracing all children and their families through our staff interactions and engagement.

We believe that meaningful and ongoing communication with parents plays a significant role in the success of every child and our program. Therefore, we are diligent in facilitating an ongoing line of communication with every family. We provide continuous service and support for the families within the community that are both respectful and responsive to our family's culture, beliefs, and abilities. We will continuously adapt services and support by evaluating our current practices and implementing new and improved methods.

We practice Continuous Quality Improvement (CQI). CQI is based on research based data, family feedback, classroom observation, and reflective practice. We utilize these findings to improve our program as a whole.

Curriculum

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool is dedicated to instilling in our children a life-long joy of learning and a positive sense of self. We believe that this type of growth develops most deeply where play is used as the primary mode of learning. Through developmentally appropriate play, children are provided opportunities to actively engage in hands-on experiences with a variety of materials. These materials will be deliberately selected for inclusive practices, based upon individual strengths, needs, interests and culture and are developmentally appropriate. This type of functional play provides the child with authentic opportunities to apply what they are learning in a practical and meaningful manner.

Anti-Bias and Anti-Discrimination Statement

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool welcomes all families, children, and staff without bias or discrimination. We promote equal access to services for all and prohibit any form of discrimination including race, color, religion, sex (including

pregnancy, sexual orientation or gender identity), national origin, disability or age. Sandia Presbyterian Preschool joyfully embraces diversity and believes that it enriches our cultural and social experiences. Our goal is to provide a community in which our children can grow and welcome the differences among us. We strive for our children to celebrate diversity and not to view our differences as a means of separation.

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool provides a safe and supportive environment where children can explore and express their own identity and interests. Through self-reflection and annual anti-bias research and training, our staff works to understand our own identity as well. We recognize that our own experiences affect others, so we provide opportunities for children and families to explore and respectfully celebrate each other and our differences.

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool strives to build a strong partnership among our children and families to create a sense of belonging, acceptance and respect of individual identities and cultures. Through this, it is our hope that our children will develop dignity and a strong sense of self that will contribute to future success.

Preschool

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool believes that children must feel accepted and safe as they grow; therefore, all children will be encouraged to interact and value each other's unique qualities. We are committed to overcoming biases to build trust and establish collaborative partnerships that benefit the children, families, and teachers of our preschool community.

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool is committed to involving its families and communities in the process of learning; therefore, we will provide weekly and monthly newsletters from both teaching staff and administration, which will encourage families to be involved in the development of the current curriculum. We provide brief communication at drop off and pick up each day. Parent/teacher conferences are scheduled twice a year to explore in depth your child's growth. Our teachers and administrators are available by appointment for further conversation.

Finally, it is vital that our staff have ample opportunities to further their knowledge regarding early childhood education. Staff will be provided regular training as well as opportunities to attend continuing education courses.

Program and Schedule

Faith Building

Faith Building is a non-denominational, age appropriate opportunity for the young children of our preschool to learn the basics of the Christian faith.

School Calendar

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool creates an annual school calendar that is shared with our families during Open House. We follow the Albuquerque Public School calendar for holidays, breaks, closures, and inclement weather with a few exceptions. In the event of a delayed opening at APS, Sandia Presbyterian Preschool will be canceled.

Fees, Payments & Penalties

Registration Fee \$175.00 per year, per child

Supply Fee \$100 per year, per child

2-Day 2 and 3 yr old Program	\$3,480.00/year(10 equal payments \$348.00)
4-Day 2 and 3 yr old Program	\$5,750.00/year (10 equal payments \$575.00)
4-Day 3, 4 and 5 yr old Program	\$5,650.00/year (10 equal payments \$565.00)

We extend a 15% discount for additional siblings, and a 10% discount for members of Sandia Presbyterian Church and Active Duty Military.

Discounts do not apply to registration fees or summer camp tuition.

Monthly tuition is based on the average daily cost per child that is then divided into 10 equal payments. There will be no refunds due to absences or illnesses. The monthly fees will remain the same each month regardless of the number of days in any given month.

Tuition is due by the 10th of every month. A late fee of 10% will be added after the 17th of each month. After the 27th of each month, the late fee will be 15%. A 15% late fee will be accrued every 10 days thereafter. We reserve the right to disenroll a child if tuition payment is delinquent over 30 days. **Please pay by check or money order made out to Sandia Presbyterian Church Preschool. Please print your child's full name on the front of the check.**

Please notify the school if you will be late picking up your child. **Parents whose children are late being picked up on a persistent basis will be charged a late fee of \$5.00 per 15 minutes at the discretion of the Preschool Director.**

Enrollment Procedure

Parents are required to submit the following information before a child can be accepted into Sandia Presbyterian Preschool:

- Completed Registration Form
- Completed Contract of Services Agreement
- Completed Emergency Information Form
- Completed Pick-Up Authorization Form
- Completed Emergency Information Cards (2)

- Signed Immunization Verification Form
- Signed Discipline Policy Form
- Signed Photo Release Form
- Signed Parent Handbook Agreement
- An official copy of immunization record
- Payment of non-refundable registration fee

Disenrollment Procedure

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool reserves the right, as circumstances may arise, to disenroll a child from the program at the discretion of the Director and the child's teacher, in consultation with the Preschool Advisory Council. Parents will be consulted at any point where a child's behavior is at issue or there is a learning need the school is unable to meet. **Every effort will be made to avoid disenrollment.** Possible reasons for disenrollment include persistent disruptive behavior, behavior that the teacher is not equipped to handle or behavior that is a clear hazard to other children or staff.

A child may be disenrolled if parents fail to abide by the conditions described in the parent handbook, including the parent agreement. **Sandia Presbyterian Preschool reserves the right to disenroll a child if tuition payment is delinquent over 30 days.**

Parents are required to provide written notification to the school Director 30 days prior to a withdrawal date. Please be aware that you are financially responsible for the 30-day period following notification.

Arrival and Dismissal

Preschool hours are from 9:00 am to 1:10 pm. Children are not to be left at the school unless a parent or guardian has completed the check-in process and delivered him/her to a staff member.

Promptness in arrival and departure is essential for the safety of our children and staff.

The arrival procedure is as follows:

- Once you enter the building, please sign your child.
- Next, please walk your child into the restroom and help wash their hands.

- Finally, please walk your child to his/her classroom, and help him/her place belongings in cubbies. Your child's teacher will be waiting at the classroom door to greet your child.

At dismissal, please proceed to the south parking lot and join the care pick-up line. We will bring your child to you when your car is at the front of the line. Although you may wish to get out of your car, parents who remain in their car while in the car line will be served first.

Your child's safety is our priority. Only those who have been added to your child's official "pick-up" authorization form will be allowed to sign your child out at the end of the day. **Compliance with these procedures will help ensure such safety.**

Lunch

Each family is expected to provide either a lunch for your child. Please use the guidance below, which is provided by the New Mexico State Childcare Regulations and provide an acceptable, nutritious lunch or snack.

All lunches should meet two of the five following criteria:

1. Protein: Cheese, Meat, Eggs
2. Bread: Crackers, Pasta, or Cereal
3. Low Fat Milk
4. Fresh Vegetables or Fruit
5. 100% Fruit or Vegetable Juice

Please be sure to supply all necessary utensils required for your child's lunch or snack.

NOTE: Due to the extreme danger of many nut allergies, Sandia Presbyterian Church Preschool offers a **NO NUT** environment. Please, no snacks or lunches with peanut butter or any nut product. Thank you!

Absences

If your child will be out of class for either the day or for an extended period of time please notify the preschool director and your child's teacher. Also, if your child will be arriving more than 10 minutes late OR if you will be arriving early to pick up your child from school in order to avoid undue disruption.

Should you have difficulty getting through to the director or teacher, please leave a message at 856-5040.

Standard Health Policy

For the protection of all children and staff, any child that comes to school appearing ill will not be admitted to the classroom. Please keep your child out of school if he/she has any of the following symptoms and until your child is symptom- free for at least 24 hours.

- Vomiting
- Pink eyes
- Contagious rash
- Fever
- Diarrhea

Please inform the Director if your child has a reportable communicable disease. The Preschool Director will inform parents of any cases of reportable communicable diseases (i.e. chicken pox, lice, salmonella).

Medication

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool will NOT administer any medications to children during school hours unless there is an extenuating need and only with written parental authorization. This includes the application of all sunscreens.

Sunscreen

We do not apply sunscreen. Please apply sunscreen daily to your child as you see fit.

Accidents/Injuries

Our staff makes every effort to maintain an environment that provides safety and prevents accidents from occurring.

Each member of our staff is trained and certified in basic first aid and CPR. If a child is injured, a member of our staff will assess the type and extent of the injury and provide immediate basic first aid as required for minor injuries. Each injury will be documented.

If your child has a minor accident at school (i.e. scraped knee, etc.), a staff member will notify you when you pick up your child. Documentation of accidents, minor or otherwise, are kept on file. If a child is involved in a more serious accident, the parent and emergency services will be called immediately.

Emergency Evacuation Plan

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool is equipped with an approved fire alarm system, overhead sprinkler system and strategically located fire extinguishers. Each classroom is equipped with fire alarm pull stations and illuminated exit signs.

All preschool staff members are regularly trained to carry out our emergency evacuation procedure. Fire evacuation exercises are routinely conducted. A

detailed emergency evacuation plan is posted in every classroom as well as the back of your parent handbook.

Parents will be notified by the preschool staff via telephone as to where to locate their child if it becomes necessary to evacuate the building and transfer the children to another location.

Pandemic Emergency Response

A pandemic is a global disease outbreak. A pandemic occurs when a virus emerges that people have little or no immunity to and for which there may be no vaccine. The disease spreads easily person-to-person and causes serious illness.

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool will implement a pandemic emergency response plan under the guidance of the CDC, federal and local governments, and the New Mexico Department of Health.

To ensure the safety of children, families and the staff, Sandia Presbyterian Preschool will monitor the situation and review guidance and suggestions from the authorities in this situation. Decisions made by the school will consider the safety of the children, family, staff and the community as a whole. Decisions may be made in accordance with or a combination of the New Mexico Public Education Department, Department of Health, and the New Mexico Early Childhood Education and Care Department. These decisions may include:

- Closure of the school
- Adjusted hours of service
- Adjusted class size
- Daily health checks of children and staff
- Limited entry into the building and access to the property
- Limitations on what the children may bring into the school

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool will communicate all plans through various means of communications such as mail, email, and Facebook.

Special Celebration Days

All children enjoy celebrating birthdays and other special days. We encourage every family to provide birthday treats to share with the class. Please let the teacher know of your plans ahead of time.

If you are planning a birthday party, outside of class, and want to invite children from the class, please do not pass out invitations at school if the entire class is not being invited. If only girls or only boys are being invited, please check with the teacher prior to passing out invitations.

Most Christian and seasonal holidays are celebrated. If your family does not celebrate a particular holiday and you would prefer your child not participate in a school celebration, alternate childcare should be made on the day's celebrations occur in the classroom. Please share these wishes with your child's teacher in advance.

Dress

Please dress your child in "play" clothes. Preschool is a place where children experiment with some messy things, such as paint, markers, play dough, sand and water.

It is important for children to use their large muscles every day; therefore, we will play outside even on cold days. Please consider this when dressing your child and include coats, hats and mittens. As the weather warms up, please remember to send a shade hat and apply sunscreen daily.

An extra set of seasonal appropriate clothing should be on hand in your child's cubby in case of accidents.

Toys from Home

Please do not bring any toys from home, except for your assigned show and tell day. After show and tell, your child will be asked to place the item in their cubby for the remainder of the day.

Toy guns, weapons, and action figures are never allowed at school!

Child Abuse/Neglect Policy for Reporting to CYFD

Sandia Presbyterian Preschool Staff are required by law to report suspected cases of child abuse or neglect to the New Mexico Department of Human

Services. Staff members are to report to the Director any unexplained injury, incident or behavior that may indicate abuse or neglect. The Director will work with the Associate Pastor and the staff member that reported the information.

If you suspect any child of being abused or neglected by any person (staff or otherwise), please notify the Director immediately, who will work with the Associate Pastor in appropriately and legally addressing concerns.

Emergency Procedure if a Child Should Go Missing

Children at the Preschool are never left unattended. In the event that a child is found to be missing, all preschool staff and employees of the church will be immediately notified, and the facility will be locked down. Staff will conduct a thorough search of all church buildings, both inside and out. Parents will be advised immediately and if appropriate, the Bernalillo County Sheriff's Department will be contacted.

Guidance Policy

Our guidance policy is based on the protection of each child's self-esteem and the safety of others. We do not believe in physical correction or any correction that ridicules or humiliates a child. If a child is in a situation that is harmful to him or herself or any other child, the child will immediately be removed from the situation.

If the child is disruptive, he/she will be offered choices to encourage development of regulation. With this approach, we are generating a loving atmosphere that encourages emotional growth.

When children are praised without evaluation, they grow in confidence. When mishaps occur and no one is blamed, they are able to focus on solutions. When their feelings are heard and understood, they become more sensitive to the feelings of others. When their autonomy is encouraged, they begin to accept responsibility for their lives.

At all times, parents will be kept informed of any circumstances that the staff is working on with your child.

Confidentiality Policy

All children and their families are held in the highest regard by our Preschool Staff. Be assured that all special circumstances that may arise will be kept in the strictest of confidence. The staff will not discuss individual children with anyone but their parent or guardian, other than for the purpose of daily planning.

Information given to the teacher or director will only be shared with other staff on a need to know basis.

The staff is always available to discuss any parent concerns. However, the staff asks that parents schedule an appointment to do so that discussions may occur in a confidential setting. **If there is an immediate need to consult with the Director or Staff member, please allow them time to complete their immediate duties with the children before beginning a conversation.**

Procedure for Filing a Complaint

Input by our families is held in the highest regard by the Preschool Staff. If at any time a parent experiences dissatisfaction with any aspect of our Preschool Program, the parent may speak with the child's Lead Teacher. If the situation is not resolved to the satisfaction of the parent or teacher, then further consultation with the Preschool Director should be pursued in an effort to resolve the issue. Should the problem persist, the parent may contact the Minister of Sandia Presbyterian Church, who will then work with the parent and Preschool Director to resolve the issue.

Parent Involvement

Parents are the most important teachers in the life of a child. Because we feel so strongly about this, we encourage your participation in some of the family engagement opportunities that are offered and believe that in doing so, your child's early learning experiences will be greatly enhanced. We offer an "Open Door" policy and encourage your involvement by volunteering. Please contact your child's teacher or the Director to sign up.
