CRIMES / INCIDENTS

Crimes recorded between 01/09/2025 and 30/09/2025.

North Queensferry – There were 3 crimes recorded during this period which relates to two separate incidents.

Inverkeithing – There were 24 crimes recorded during this period. This includes 9 crimes recorded for traffic offences with other crimes such as vandalism, assault and threatening and abusive behaviour.

Dalgety Bay/Hillend – There were 17 crimes recorded during this period. Most crimes were for theft by shoplifting and traffic offences.

Aberdour – There was 6 crimes recorded within Aberdour during the month of August. This includes crimes such as Fraud, assault and wilful fire-raising.

CALLS TO POLICE

Dates: 01/08/2025 to 31/08/2025

36 calls relate to North Queensferry. The vast majority relate to the motorway network or FRB.

113 calls relate to the Inverkeithing area.

25 calls relate to the Aberdour area.

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96 calls relate to the Dalgety Bay/Hillend area.

Remainder of the calls were miscellaneous matters / information only

COMMUNITY WARD UPDATE

There has been a decline in recorded crimes and call volume during this period which was anticipated after a busy summer period.

During the summer, throughout West Fife and the wider region there has been an increase in Wilful Fire-raising incidents. This has recently settled down, so it was disappointing to see a fire raising near to

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Braefoot plantation recorded during this month. Enquires are on-going to trace those responsible but it goes without saying how serious these incidents can be.

Community officers have seen an increase in graffiti in Dalgety Bay mostly within the eastern area of the Bay. This includes numerous tags with the initials "KB" and reference to BLOCK 7. Officers have linked in with local primary schools and Inverkeithing High School to identify potential suspects. If anyone has information to help trace the individual/groups responsible, can they please contact Police Scotland via the contact us link below.
