Police Report

Chief McEnerney provided an update on ticket activity in the Village; he wrote approximately 10 tickets on Overlook since the construction started. He also reported that 4th of July festivities went well.

The board also discussed the e-bikes legislation that will be effective next calendar year.

Engineer's Report

Sarah Ronan reported that we received two proposals for coring and patching on Orchard Lane. She recommended S&C Construction at a price of \$3822 based on price and responsiveness. She also reached out to Schroeder about the patching, and they will get back to her with a probable post-September date (along with pricing). Orchard Lane would be complete in spring or fall 2027.

Trustee Kalogerakos moved to approve the spend of \$3,822 to S&C Construction to provide coring services on Orchard and other spots around the Village. Trustee Burden seconded the motion.

Approval of Bills

Emergency Services Department

Trustee Ross had nothing to report.

Building and Zoning Department

Trustee Burden had nothing to report; however, she did share that the first permit was issued for the lead service line remediation.

Public Buildings and Grounds Department

Trustee Shine shared that there have been many downed limbs, and Lucas has helped clear the Village as a one-time cleanup. Landscape Concepts Design has made small improvements around the Village Hall, and the payment has been identified between the Village and the IL PGA. In addition, 4-5 more trees have been planted.

Finance and Administration Department

Trustee Miller shared that our financial position remains strong.

Streets and Sanitation Department

Trustee Kalogerakos had nothing to report.

Utilities Department

Trustee Landman shared that there is an agreement in principle with LRS, with the following terms: a one time increase of 7.27% and subsequent increases of 3% each year for a contract over 7 years.

He also shared that he is still working with the Glenview Park District to address the ballfield.

President's Report

President Farr reported that the Independence Day fireworks went well (slightly earlier) and then the 4th activities were shifted slightly based on weather but generally good attendance.

He also shared some of the discussion around the 100th year celebration with positive comments. There have been discussions about fundraising opportunities such as bricks, benches, clock tower opportunities, and possibly honorary street naming (Highland Park). Other ideas included signs and license plates.

The police chief also mentioned the impact of Flock cameras and, to combat any 'Deflock' discussions, noted that they're a great investigative tool.

Adjourn

Trustee Kalogerakos moved to adjourn the meeting. Trustee Landman seconded the motion. The motion passed unanimously. The meeting was adjourned at 7:42 pm.
