Associate Educator License (AEL) Requirements for **Special Education (K-12+)**

If you have a current Utah Professional Educator License or a current Utah Associate Educator License in another teaching area (e.g. Secondary, Special Education), you have already completed Steps 1-3 (Educator Record, USIMS Checklist Items, and AEL Canvas Modules).

If you do not yet hold a Utah Professional or Utah Associate Educator License in another teaching area, you will need to complete all the following steps before submitting your application for an AEL:

1. Create your Utah Educator Record

Create a profile in the <u>Utah Schools Information Management System (USIMS)</u>.

- **Sign up** for an account.
- Provide a personal email address.
- Check your email to retrieve the **verification code**.
- Use verification code to continue setting up your profile, providing **Personal Information**, and looking up your information.
- Click on **Personal Information** to retrieve your **Cactus ID**. Your Cactus ID is your educator identification number; you will need this number to complete your application.

2. Successfully complete all USIMS Checklist Items

- Log in to your <u>USIMS account</u>.
- Answer Licensing Issues questions.
- Request Criminal Background Review, if prompted. You will need to provide your social security number and your date of birth to complete this step. Once requested, you will receive the instructions to complete fingerprinting; these instructions may be revisited by clicking on Criminal Background Review. Once fingerprints are received, it can take 2-12 weeks to complete the background review depending on your background history.
- Complete **Educator Ethics Review**. Please Note: If you haven't completed the Educator Ethics Review within the previous year, you will need to retake it.
- You may log in to your USIMS account at any time to review these items.

3. Complete all four Educator Licensing Pedagogical Modules in Canvas

***Educators who hold an associate or professional Utah educator license may skip this step

Enroll in Educator Licensing Pedagogical Modules and complete all four Canvas courses.

If you already have a USBE Canvas account and do not remember your password, please click on "Forgot Password?" after entering your email address on the <u>USBE Canvas login page</u>.

4. Have a bachelor's degree or higher from an accredited institution

Candidates for Special Education must provide transcripts from institutions from which you earned a degree. You must also provide a transcript from your Special Education program, even if you have not completed the program.

- The Utah State Board of Education may accept electronic transcripts only if sent directly from the college/university via <u>transcripts@schools.utah.gov</u>. Visit the <u>Transcript</u> webpage for USBE policy on submitting official transcripts.
- If applying from a foreign country, first send your academic records for a transcript course-by-course and degree evaluation to a foreign credential evaluation service via National Association of Credential Evaluation Services (NACES).

5. Be enrolled in a Special Education educator preparation program

To be eligible for an Associate Educator License (AEL) in Special Education, you must be enrolled in a teacher preparation program that leads to a professional or standard teaching license in Special Education. This can be:

- The APPEL-SpEd program administered by the Utah State Board of Education, or
- A special education program at an accredited university that leads to a professional or standard (NASDTEC Stage 2) educator license in the state where the program is based

To confirm your enrollment in a special education teacher preparation program, please submit a letter verifying your enrollment. The letter can be from a faculty member, program director, or records office. **The letter must include:**

- Official letterhead: It must show the name of your school (like Utah State University).
- Your name
- **Program name:** It must say the name of the teacher preparation program you're in (like Bachelor of Arts in Special Education).
- **License area:** It must say the type of teaching license you're working towards (like Special Education with Mild/Moderate endorsement).
- Current enrollment: It must say that you are currently enrolled in the program.
- Matching program and license: The preparation program you are enrolled in must match the type of license you are applying for. For example, if you want a license in Secondary Math, you must be in a program like a Bachelor of Arts in Mathematics Education.
- **Contact information:** It must have the phone number and/or email address for the individual providing verification.
- **Signature:** It must be signed by someone who can confirm enrollment.

Important Notes:

We **don't** accept any of the following as evidence of enrollment:

- copies of transcripts
- enrollment verification from a national clearinghouse
- acceptance or welcome letters.

Upload a PDF of the enrollment verification letter to your AEL application.

- Name the file with your name and CACTUS ID.
- **Example:** 34621 Jane Doe Enrollment Verification.pdf

6. Demonstrate minimum Special Education content competencies

Individuals seeking an AEL in Special Education must successfully demonstrate minimum content knowledge competencies in special education by *completing one* (1) of the following requirements:

Complete one (1) of the following and provide the required documentation listed:

- A. DirectSTEP Trainings Letter from APPEL-SpEd
 - a. You will need to attach a pdf copy of your letter of completion to your AEL application. For more information on the DirectSTEP Trainings, enroll in the USBE Alternate Assessments Canvas module or email appel-sped@schools.utah.gov.
- B. USBE Running Start (only available in summer) MIDAS Transcript
 - a. You will need to attach a copy of your MIDAS transcript showing USBE Running Start. For more information on USBE Running Start, enroll in the <u>USBE Alternate</u> <u>Assessments Canvas module</u> or email <u>appel-sped@schools.utah.gov</u>.
- C. Praxis exam Score report
 - a. Pass one (1) of the following approved Praxis exams:
 - i. Praxis 5355 Special Education: Foundational Knowledge
 - ii. Praxis 5543 Special Education: Core Knowledge & Mild/Moderate Applications
 - iii. Praxis 5547 Special Education: Severe to Profound Applications
 For information on how to register for the Praxis test, visit the ETS Website:
 https://www.ets.org/praxis/. When you register for the test, request a copy of your test scores be sent to the Utah State Board of Education (USBE). You will attach a pdf copy of your score report to your AEL application.
- **D.** Degree major in special education Transcript from university
- E. Proof of Equivalency as determined by APPEL-SpEd Team Letter from APPEL-SpEd
 - a. If you believe that you have significant training in special education equivalent to degree major, but have not met one of the options above, please contact the APPEL-SpEd team by email appel-sped@schools.utah.gov.

7. Demonstrate minimum Special Education Law Competencies

Individuals seeking an AEL in Special Education must successfully demonstrate minimum Special Education Law competencies *completing one (1) of the following* requirements:

Complete one (1) of the following and provide the required documentation listed:

- USBE Special Education Law Training Course
 - Create a MIDAS account and register for MIDAS course #59403. Use the e-mail address of your CACTUS record for your login ID.
 - Complete the USBE SpEd Law Training (MIDAS course 59403) at 80% or better.
 - Attach a pdf copy of your MIDAS Transcript showing the completed SPED Law Training course to your AEL application.
- Special Education Law University Course completed after Jan 2005, e.g., "Special Education Law" or "Policies & Procedures for Special Education"
 - Submit official transcripts to <u>transcripts@schools.utah.gov</u>
- University course covering special education law completed after January 2005.
 - Submit official transcripts to <u>transcripts@schools.utah.gov</u>
 - Course syllabus

8. Submit the Associate Educator License application.

Create an SM Apply account.

Select "Associate Educator License (AEL) Application" and submit an application.

You will receive an email notification when the USBE Licensing Department has processed your application. Please allow approximately 4-6 weeks to process your application.
