REPORTS AND RECOGNITION

Board Chair's Report: Chairwoman Pote expressed sentiments about Dr. Rodrigue. Region 12 truly won the lottery when Dr. Rodrigue returned—not once, but twice—to serve as interim superintendent. We were incredibly fortunate. She's been so much more than a superintendent; she's been family. It has been an absolute honor to work alongside her. Tonight is Dr. Rodrigue's last Board meeting.

Dr. Rodrigue stated that returning was easy and described it as one of the best boards she has ever worked with and said she is truly honored to be part of it.

Chairwoman Pote thanked Gregory Cava, who will be leaving the board. She expressed sadness over his departure, acknowledging that although they've had bumps in the road, his contributions were deeply valued. She emphasized that his absence will be more than just an empty seat and shared her sincere gratitude for his service.

Gregory Cava said it's been an honor to be part of such a phenomenal board. He shared that Chairwoman Pote has truly impressed him and turned him into a fan, noting that she's really stepped up. He added that the board wouldn't be where it is today without her leadership.

Gregory Cava also thanked Dr. Rodrigue, saying she helped move the program forward and got things back on track. He noted that she didn't act like an interim, but like a full-time superintendent, and added that he couldn't thank her enough.

Chairwoman Pote mentioned the baseball game that will be on June 10, 2025 at 3:30 p.m. in Berlin, CT.

Superintendent's Report: Dr. Rodrigue stated that we are days away from the close of the school year. She's been visiting all the schools. She mentioned that it is so wonderful to see how the children feel about their teachers and sad that the school year is ending. Lastly she said it has been a pleasure working in Region 12.

Treasurer's Report: Alex McNaughton - Stated the F & O Committee met earlier today at 4:00 p.m. He stated that his Treasurer's report overlapped with the F & O Committee report. They discussed transfers between departments that are reassigning dollars to be spent in those same departments that the department heads requested but that does not add to the budget. They discussed redoing the backstop of the baseball fields. He mentioned that it will keep the balls from going into the woods and it will protect the children. He also mentioned they will be asking for approval later in the meeting to move money in the 2% fund. Lastly they will be talking about the cost to fix the elevators and the library projects.

Nicole Grant mentioned they received the final agriscience audit at 2:00 p.m. today and the state released an additional \$760,000 which will go into our building fund to be used for future projects.

Committee Reports:

- a. Agriscience Committee - Mary Weber - Tyler gave an update on the end of the year and the last few events coming up. She shared that UConn held a spring field day where two of our groups took first place—Food Service and Parliamentary Procedure. She also proudly announced that Mina Kareden became the first agriscience student from our program to be voted in as a state FFA official. Over the summer, students will take part in the Bridgewater Fair and help clean the facility. There's a focus on blending the Shepaug and agriscience students so they work together and see themselves as one group. Finally, she attended the FFA Banquet and Awards Night, and what really stood out to her was seeing the students rise and cheer as their peers received awards—it was a powerful moment.
- b. Curriculum & Educational Programming Committee - Justin Ongley - It was shared that there was a meeting earlier tonight, and a few changes are coming to the middle school. For Physical Education in 7th and 8th grade, students will now have two options: 'Sports Strategies and Games' or 'Personal Fitness and Activity.' The idea is to give students who aren't interested in competitive sports a chance to focus on their own fitness. In the CTE department, some courses are being reshuffled—TV Studio will move to 8th grade, Robotics will be offered in 7th grade, and Project Lead the Way will be introduced in 6th grade. Lastly, 30 teachers will be working on writing the summer curriculum.
- c. EdAdvance - Joseph Abdella - At the last Board of Directors meeting on June 5, 2025, the board approved three items related to the Head Start Program: a grant application, a self-assessment plan, and an enrollment priorities program. During the meeting, Jonathan informed the board that funding for the student mental health grant from the U.S. Department of Education will be cut short, with current funding ending in December 2025. This reduction poses challenges for hiring and retaining mental health staff. In response,

they are preparing a letter to challenge the decision, supported by many other representatives. The program has lost \$5 million of the \$8 million initially promised.

- d. Finance & Operations Committee - Alex McNaughton - They went over the numbers as of June 6, 2025 and we have 8% of the budget remaining compared to May 31, 2024 there was 9.66% of the budget remaining but we are in a good position for the end of the school year. One of the other things they talked about that Nicole gave us a presentation on is the work that is going to be done on the library at Shepaug Valley School he stated that it looks like the final cost will be \$552,336.00. He stated that we are having elevator issues, we are looking to put generators in all of the schools but as of right now they've only received two bids and they were so far apart, so they are going to start the process over again.
- e. Labor Negotiations - Gregory Cava - No negotiations yet but this fall they will be negotiating with the teachers union and he urges us to get on that as soon as possible, don't wait until they give you a date for an arbitration proceeding. Whoever chairs the negotiations committee will want to get on that as soon as possible working with our council.
- f. Policy Committee - Justin Ongley - Stated they looked at Policy 2000 which involves the Superintendent of schools and evaluation we will be looking at later in the meeting.
- g. Strategic - Long Range Planning Committee - Jennifer Pote - No report.
