## **A Few Financial Aid Facts and Figures**

Go to [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) to fill out your FAFSA online.

To receive federal student aid, you must have earned a high school diploma or GED, be enrolled at least half time, be a U.S. Citizen, have a Social Security number, make satisfactory academic progress, and (for males) register with the Selective Service. If you are a male and at least 17, it's best to log on to: [www.sss.gov](http://www.sss.gov) where you can get a jump on mandatory registration. This is a good benefit when you consider registering can help you obtain future job training or federal employment. Congress has made several changes in how monies will be distributed to students nationwide. To qualify as an independent student you must meet one of the following criteria: (1) veteran, (2) ward of the court, (3) married, (4) have a dependent child and show income to support the dependent child, (5) at least 24 years old, (6) graduate student. Homeowners of family farms (if they reside on their farm property) don't have to report those assets to the government when applying for their student's financial aid. Congress has also increased the federal loan eligibility limits, which should help the bottom line of what a family must pay to put their son or daughter through college.

A. You will need to use your parent's 2023 tax forms to complete the FAFSA. The state deadline for the FAFSA is February 1<sup>st</sup>; however, some schools have earlier deadlines for financial aid offered strictly through their college/university. Check the college/university's website or call its financial aid office for further details.

B. Benefits of the Online FAFSA:

1. It's free! You don't have to pay to apply for federal student aid. Free help completing your application is available from the FAFSA website [www.fafsa.ed.gov](http://www.fafsa.ed.gov) or by calling 1-800-4-FED-AID.
2. It's easy! The website is easy to navigate. Extensive online help is available, and you can skip questions that don't apply to you.
3. It's accurate! Filing online allows you to use the IRS Data Retrieval Tool, which transfers tax return information directly from the IRS website into your FAFSA! This is the best way to ensure that your FAFSA has accurate tax information.

## How to Apply for Scholarships

1. The applications for the following scholarships listed are to be completed and returned to the Counselors' Office or the indicated address by the due date shown.
2. Apply for all scholarships for which you may be eligible. **DO NOT rule yourself out!**
3. You want to create a good impression to the selection committee with your application form. Therefore, give careful attention to how you complete the application form.
  - **Type applications** – Do not hand write (except “Scholarship Name” at the top).
  - **Use standard size, white paper** when printing applications and **staple** all pages together (including references) in the upper **left hand** corner.
  - **Do not put applications in folders, envelopes, or binding.**
  - **Fill in all spaces.** If a space does not apply to your situation, you should use “N/A” to indicate this is not applicable. **DO NOT LEAVE ITEMS BLANK.**
  - **Be honest.** If you are undecided about something, say so. However, it is to your advantage to have some fairly definite answers to the questions.
4. **IF YOU ARE APPLYING FOR MORE THAN ONE SCHOLARSHIP THAT USES THE GENERAL SCHOLARSHIP FORM:** Fill out Section I **before** giving Section II to your counselor (**Counselors cannot fill out Section II until January**). Counselors will need to see a copy of your completed resume and page one of your SAR prior to completing Section II. Have your counselor fill out Section II **before** you make copies of your application; do not wait until the deadline to get this done. Your counselor will only fill out the original form; do not expect her to complete every copy you make. Leave the name of the scholarship blank until after your counselor has filled out Section II and **then** make copies.
5. After a student has completed the General Application form, including the counselors' section, it will be the student's responsibility to photocopy the application and resume. This can be done either outside of school or in the media center. **Due to the large number of applicants and the large number of scholarships, the Counseling Office copier cannot accommodate students' application photocopy needs.**
6. As specified on the General Application, **a resume is REQUIRED for all scholarships** that use the General Application. You must include a copy of your resume with each General Application that you submit.
7. If you ask someone to write a recommendation letter for you, you must give the person at least two weeks' notice to write a good letter. **Provide them with a resume or LETTER OF RECOMMENDATION REQUEST FORM, which can be found on the Counselors' website.** Staple the letter(s) to the rest of your application in the upper left hand corner.
8. Be sure to meet all deadlines so that you can receive full consideration. The MAJORITY of these scholarships (unless otherwise stated) are due **Thursday, February 6.** Applications due to the Counseling Office will **not** be accepted after 3:30 p.m. on this date.
9. You may want to save a copy of the General Scholarship application for use in completing additional scholarship applications in the future.

10. Scholarships are an ongoing process – Visit the CHS Counseling web page and Facebook page and listen carefully to the announcements concerning the latest offerings. Also, be sure to listen for details regarding the Annual Boylan Art and Writing Contests and the Flanigan Speech Contest in the spring.
11. There are many scholarships available from specific college/university programs. Call or check the website of the college/university you are interested in to find out about financial aid and scholarships available through that school. Take the initiative to know what is available for you and apply.
12. **DISCLAIMER:** Every effort has been made for the information listed in this booklet to be as up-to-date and accurate as possible at the time of publication. However, some amounts may vary according to interest rates on available funds, and deadlines set by outside organizations may change. Additionally, the availability of some scholarships may change due to economic factors.
