

(Second Set of Questions)

1. What are the changes & losses that have already happened in your family, your community, or your parish that are hard to accept?

Family - our children don't live their faith or practice their religion like we all did at their age.

Community - our medical center was on a decline and not has gotten together within another

health care. **Parish** - they are rural and share 1 priest between 2 churches we have nothing but 1 Mass a week at a bad time

Losses of parishioners (lukewarm families leaving). Many pastoral changes. No real shepherd for a long time.

Priests being moved often.

My children (son and daughter) left the catholic church when they got married.

Health - sister in law, mother in law's mental issues. Poor city finances. Silent churches. No community. No adoration, no altar rails, no full processions

Participation in parish community is not how it was when I was younger, fewer people helping out-the same people are responsible for too much

Many people attend church for years and then you don't see them anymore. Why? After confirmation you don't see these young people attending Mass.

Many parishioners grow older, have less contact with family or spouses who have passed, and become lonely.

Covid did a lot of damage. Prayer for healing in the extended family

School decline in population. Change of pastors and with each a new direction. Change in people's socializing - now isolated. The aging process reduced abilities disordering priorities leading to "me" first living

several people died who were along time members of the church and community

loss of my child and best friend

parents and siblings leaving the church. No solidified Christmas plans. Our priest leaving

Loss of family members and friends that seems to happen faster now. I'm 78. My kids are in their 40s and some grandkids almost 30

Non-welcoming church to other religions/. We accept people from other denominations and we will take their money, but we will not give them communion - whereas their parishes welcome people and let them receive communion.

Families no longer think they need their faith. Parents have not left the impression that God comes first

Loss of a love one, loss of family attending Mass

Political bias rooted in the parish/church not in keeping with Pope Leo's message or Christ. Use of alcohol to bring people into church (i.e. Catholicism on tap) what that says/promotes and education/events who it turns away

the changing of our priest

Family- Loss of steve and cancer. **Parish** - pastors deacons priests all change. some volunteers can't do what they used and no mentoring

Loss our Newman parish lost job through retirement lost parents lost track of my sister

My age

loss of priest father Sam; oldest child leaving for college

Parish school is no longer the vibrant community-supported school we once had. There are so few families enrolled and fewer families with children who are dedicated beyond showing up for sacraments and CCD people have left our parish because their community organizations are not as active as once were

My husband was fired from his job at Mayo after working three for 20 years because he was denied religious exemption from the Covid shot, which he felt very strongly was a great harm to his soul and his body. But in the end it was a great blessing because what used to be Franciscan healthcare with God at the center is now Mayo with money as their god

Death of my husband. Death of parents.

Lack of support for things that are important to society: we can send billions for a sport facility but little for important things.

Change in family as parents age and my husband siblings and I take on a caretaker role

young people leaving church

Family/friends leave church. Changes in culture in parish.

burnout of clergy; growing violence in public sector

Family: Lost father and father-in-law. We're the only ones in town to support our moms. **Parish:** lots of turnover in recent years with priests, have good stability now who plans to stay until retired. Closed SH-St. Joseph Hospitals in community

Loss of loved ones (family friends and nephews)

Child going to college. School losing students. Older parents.

The grandchildren are grown and moving on with their lives and I miss the time when they were little and all spent together. We left our former parish after 40 years there because our new pastor treats it as his parish not ours.

family-less members attending Mass. **Community** - increasing crime, less compassion **church**-less members due to conflicts involving Fr. Altman

*Christianity becoming untolerated or a minority voice

Our parish linked with 2 others. Always getting the short end. The passing of Brother Michael. Having kneelers appear one Sunday for communion. Why go backwards? Our priest singing the Mass - I hate it

That the church will try to conform itself to the world, that it will take a poll to see where God is directing it rather than listening to the Holy Spirit

The loss of our parents and the fact that our family doesn't go to mass regularly.

Loss of family members-illness-loss of a bereavement group in parish-we so desperately one-People need to turn to the church and know they are needed and wanted-Grief is a big issue for many. They will go somewhere else, leave and not have faith.

That my one daughter (I have a family of 4 children) along with her husband do not go to mass weekly. They watch on TV from Covid era. They do go with us when they come home, but they are missing out on communion.

Moving from our home back to our hometown after 25 years, within 3 months of our youngest child graduating high school. Several life changes within just a few months. As far as parish—involvement (past and present).

Deaths of people close to us; several were members of our parish

Children moved out/had their own families went from moving to assist my elderly mother to taking care of spouse with Alzheimer's/dementia to living now by myself after moving here 2/5 years ago

Our kids are not as devoted to their religion as could be they believe in the religion but sometimes life gets busy and church isn't always 1st in line for them

Lack of interest especially from the 20 to 50 year old residents. Priest that give a small rural parish time for only 1 or 2 Masses a week, does not take the time to know us

Granddaughters getting older; division in family; not working at my job

I have lost 2 brothers-in-law but that natural life cycle. They were older than me but was still active. One had dementia.

Lost brother to suicide.

The loss of the hospital and the lack of faith in the young people I teach and how that we will accept this in the future.

getting the feeling that a few of our children aren't on a spiritual journey. It seems that attending Mass is not important

The number of parishioners has been greatly reduced over the years. Hearing that families who have children in the parish school don't attend Mass because "they get enough of that during the week". Families not attending Mass and treating the school as a "private school" education. Suggestions not being taken seriously for how to pay their tuition.

So far, so good - none

Family not involved in Church family getting older and farther away not seeing the family as much

Hurtful relationships between family members. I pray they find their way to Jesus who will lead them and heal them back to healthy relationships. The school families that are not at Mass or involved with our parish activities.

Death of family members, decline of parish picnic, moral decline of society

great grandchildren not being baptized or coming to church

I have lost so many family members already - all my brothers and one sister

More funerals than baptisms losing our catholic schools

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Family: my daughters and granddaughter live too far away to allow me to be a physical grandmother and mother to them. **Community:** Lack of concern for the environment grows in my lack of respect-**Parish:** we have lost good people of our parish-important for the fabric of our parish their talents are not present anymore

Lost 2 sisters, priest leaving

Older parishioners passing on, folk who are active in helping out (funerals) and with PCCW activities

Loss of parents (family) - closing of church years back it was her eat the time

My grandpa passed during covid and we would take him to church on weekends before he passed - when teaching religion education the only child that goes to church on weekends in my class is my own - my son stopped going to church - Fr. Zweber was transferred to a different parish and our family has a good connection with him

Families are not attending weekend masses. Busy with jobs sports, and there activities that are schedule for Sunday mornings. Individuals who are gay and lesbian do not feel welcome within the church priest is hard to understand. Leaves for 1 month to return to his homeland

The loss of "leaders" in parish positions. A pastor change from American to Indian - culture shock!

Losses of my sister and brother; loss of our priest we did have

several of my children no longer attend Mass, which affects their children

the absence/loss of good, strong, faithful Catholic teens for my kids

None-trust in God allows me to accept all things in this life as temporary and educational family -kids grown and moved out church -less attending

The passing of our eldest parishioners, those who have laid the foundation for our community and parish, and how that affects our church. My mother in law not being able to stay in her home of 14 years due to age (100); places of business closing down - where we could gather with people away from church

Foreign priests are harder to understand but it has led to great leadership from our parish office manager, Finance Chairman and School Principal. It has not affected access to sacraments. Decline attendance - accent hard to understand.

Death of my brother at age 17 *death of parents when they were in their 70s. I'm 71 now, fear of a limited time to accomplish all I want to get done *a former priest who was a good theologian but not a parish priest *our parish was close to closing

Seeing worship turn to Pre-Vatican II

I've seen too many people fall way from the faith, particularly family members. I have already seen so much consolidation.

Separation of beliefs/disconnect and lack of want to follow Christ together. Using the church/bible against people.

My son does not go to church.

loss of people in the 25-50 year old range that practice their faith

I have 4 children; only one goes to church 2 don't go and one goes to the Lutheran church

Divorce, aging parents, turning 40, selling all my belongings/car/house.

That there are so many people that are no longer coming to mass.

*loss of good priest - two good priests *brothers and sister away from the faith

Amish farmers and community; children moved to other cities; increased homeschooling families; closing of St. Mary's ridge school and decreased enrollment at St. Sacred Heart school; the following years Latin Mass community (12pm SM) moved to worship elsewhere

locking church doors

Community has no areas of business where folks can gather; the community isn't vibrant and growing; volunteerism in the church is there for only a few events.

My husband and child, parents, grandparents, aunts, and uncles have died. Moving from one home to another. Friends gone or moved away

Loss of school, loss of children in parish. But it was a sound financial move

Loss of parents; watching parents age with physical and mental challenges loss of closeness of siblings - parish watching all of our special projects diminish dure to priest unable to manage so many things in 3 parishes - Diminishing numbers in our Catholic schools

that as our congregation passes on, our message on faith and care will go with them

*not enough priests and not enough students for own school

*covid changes the community a bunch *too much politics in church *lost the family feel of our church

The younger generation will quit coming and the church will no longer exist

father Mark left Newman; he was my best teach ever. I attended most of his classes

We will move to way too conservative practices. Have way too much inner devotion that would replace participation. If laity participates-we wouldn't fear the loss of our priest/pastor so much.

there is a definite change in the feeling of community and commitment in our parish and especially our school

my husband has been diagnosed with cancer; my children moved away; a friend has turned he back on the church; my husband and I both retired; increase in homelessness and many issues/crime because of this in our community

Going to Mass and needing 2 large pews to hold my family. Now I sit alone. My children and grandchildren can't understand the priest so they moved to another parish. No Latin Mass is heartbreaking.

family - children have grown and moved away and started their own family. **community** - loss of business/growth. **parish** - loss of youth attending Mass Family parents are aging have health issues

Closing churches

All are married and we rarely get together anymore; all my brothers and sisters have died. My friendly neighbors are gone also

*children have stopped going to mass *granddaughter has not had her children baptized *how will their babies make it through life without God?

How many seemingly good marriages are divorcing

*closures of small parishes *what happens if there aren't enough youth to take over for the aging population?

Family - kids not attending mass, not believing in Catholic church. **Community**- homeless population blowing up and feeling like La Crosse takes care of that at the cost of our kids. **Parish** - loss of front door ministry at cathedral - lack of marriage or frequency of divorce - too easy and tears families apart - family values

kids grow up and leave but don't come back--; loss of family and friends

Declining numbers and not reaching our youth. Aging priests, fewer vocations-lead to parishes closing and unavailability of priests/sacraments

family leaving Catholic church or stop attending Mass

my parents are gone and my siblings and I are drifting apart; the parishes do not seem as close family style; there isn't as much parish social get togethers

to my mind the only change that matters is that the Church has been subjected to a rupture, separating its people and clergy from what she always was. The smoke of satan that extended the sanctuary all local changes and losses are extensions of that central and catechetical changes I feel we need to start working at the local parish level to slowly incrementally close that rupture and clear away that smoke I think we are allowing ourselves to become distracted by the other changes and things that really do not matter

*the loss of our parents/closeness of our family * more crime, not knowing our neighbors *less masses and times at our church

Death, illness, friends are distant due to relocation

Lack of participation in church functions, the parish school never starting again. Lack of respect is already shown by the failure to "dress up" for Mass

*churches close *people become bore worldly and less holy

That my immediate family don't want to belong to the church or anything with the Lord. Also the families are not bringing up people to believe in God and the Church. None of my sisters, brothers, in-laws want to partake in Church any more. They don't even want to baptize the children.

my brother left the faith; my parents lost the beliefs that mass must be attended weekly. I grew up without education on adoration and Vatican II st. Stanislaus and Newman combined; the Newman center was closed. Fr. Todd got moved. Churches got remodeled to simpler less ornate altars and sanctuaries. My Mass got Latin parts changed to English

children have left our parish

I returned to the area. The gossip and false info about my life events has been lies. No one asks me; assumptions become their facts. Family has died. I am alone facing serious illness. As a survivor of priest abuse not helped grieving. The death of my step son in 1995; he was born with and his younger brother in 1982 in San Francisco. His mom given bad blood 10 hours before birth - she died. My aunt was buried in NC yesterday. Her death actually is the same date. Her daughter my best friend was found dead of alcoholism; she drove me to treatments and she died on her sobriety anniversary

My fear that is greatest for our parish specifically is that it could be closed due to poor physical conditions and lack of future options. This fear compounds and the lack of leadership turns into and lack of attendance people become lethargic

People losing their faith/leaving the Church due to lack of understanding or catechesis. Not being seen or being heard, or not finding mentorship or community within their parish.

Loss of our kids attending Mass not practicing people in their neighborhood and causing upheavals just because they don't agree on things loss of community with our registered parishes because of inability to attend Sunday Mass

Does this matter?

*whitewashed Catholicism *children leaving home, living on their own, living in sin and not attending mass weekly *parents and siblings that have left the faith *poor catechization

parents gone, holidays and other events very different. People still watch church on TV instead of going to mass

not attending Mass regularly - switching to another religion

Children & their friends leaving church. Choosing to reject traditional values.

*movement away from God and Christianity and the teachings of the Bible *killing of Christians *expansion of Islam

Family: political division-a parental death. **Community:** the homeless problem-the environmental problems-lack of volunteers to help feed the hungry-lack of funding. **Parish:** introduction of FOCUS-the backwards sliding to a more conservative church i.e. women wearing veils and communion on the tongue-UCK! Lack of good musicians at the same Mass-only have a piano player and cantor. It works, but would like more

Loss of the farming community - kids don't stay, homes are sold off to people with no connection to community and they seem to want one. Our entire community was once catholic and now we are surrounded by people who don't belong to any church

*our parish closing *the parish is not growing and we are losing our elderly

As traditional catholic, being kicked out of my parish to "the frays" when the Traditional Latin Mass was suppressed 1/1/2023. Watching young couples jump through hoops for the sacraments is unjust: 1. waiting several months for the diocese to approve the wedding in a non-parish setting 2. watching new parents drive their days old baby 3+ hours to get baptized, even on bad roads 3. watching my kids - who draw immensely in the faith in the TLM have deep sadness no longer being welcome in their parish is heartbreaking

Having an older sibling that was many years ago a person I look up to, so much a parish a part of our parish, no longer coming to Mass

the school has declined in numbers from 120's to 80's despite it being an excellent school

the attendance of Catholics not attending Mass, whether it be daily, weekly, holy days. The lack of interest in our Catholic faith. Having our priest leave our parish

That our young people will not step up and not carry on our church traditions

*loss of our main morning mass *loss of regular programming and education by our priests since our merger - most if not all is done at the other parish *loss of careful fiscal reporting by our priests

the change of not having our family all in the near vicinity not see them as often as would like

the losses of many elderly family members - mom, dad, aunts and uncles and cousins (we are the old one now) *all the places that have closed - malls, stores, etc. Everything is done online.

*no personal communication with others

Family: loss of faith, attending Mass by own children **Community:** loss of parishioners at Mass...more concerned with work schedules, getting ahead or their own relaxing. Schools having programs on Wednesday nights had been prohibited in the past. Sundays are filled with games and tournaments. How do we protest our rights to profess our faith?

My children leaving the house and living far away. My nephew coming out as transgender a few years ago. Loss of Sacred Heart Hospital

many people have left the church, especially young people *the loss of desire for God

Division within my own family, siblings that have left the catholic faith

Parish getting smaller fewer people

I am the only one left in my family. Our community is now a retirement community with very few families left.

At sacred heart in Marshfield went from 3 Masses each weekend to 1. Now the hospital in town has changed ownership 4 times -used to be Catholic and is now secular

children not going to church, hurts caused by thoughtless actions and brushed under the rug. Don't see the value in priests helping to counsel

Kids grow up and move out and move away. Growing indifference to Christian faith & life.

My son going to the university my son signing to the army seeing father Juan Pedro leave to another community

businesses that have closed down the loss of both parents and siblings other young family members

people moving away from our Catholic faith, thus closing churches and schools

death of spouse son not practicing faith sharing of pastor 2 parishes with different missions (I grieved at that time when adjusted to Mass but my faith community was still there for me a still is I adjust as with any grieving

Divorce and how affected my children-loss of stores-loss of jobs-moving to a new community and leaving all my friends behind

that there won't be a place where I feel welcome so much movement to pre-vatican practices marriage distance, adult children not attending mass

only one Mass per day on weekends per parish passing for our solid church members

Father and Father-in-law passed away. Had to give up my previous career due to health issue. Had become involved in the church (St. Pat's) and school; Corpus Christi, Christmas décor, coaching, among other things, became excluded.

current priest does not feel connected to the people of the parish. How do we get our grandchildren to be part of a church community

children have moved away comments of people who find these/fs homily pastor is focusing on the youth to the exclusion of the longstanding members

Son's family not attending mass.

My grandchildren are starting to leave the area one by one! I love being a grandma-3 parishes in my community and I can't attend any of them. I drive 20 miles to church because of the ultra-conservatism of all of them

financial instability and decreasing attendance increased security measures needed

the population has shrunk there are fewer children in the community and in the church fewer young people are getting married fewer young people are have a faith society will becoming post Christian

*parish church torn down *people driven away and you never see them again *son lost friends to murder by a priest

losing the associate priest

loss of Mass times - loss of choice and opportunity

*Family - loss of son *Community different parenting/lack of children are the most precious gift of a man and woman and need to be taught/directed to be successful adults when they grow up. *Parish - some members not willing to except change

My family hosted a 4th of July mass for 40+ (48?) years. Our father passed away June of 2024. We wanted to have the mass as we normally did at our farm this year, 2025. The pastor said we couldn't do a mass do to Diocesan rule. So we did a prayer service. Stil don't believe we couldn't do mass.

*growth, attendance *clergy not talking about social and political issues that are contrary to the church's teachings "too much sugar coated preaching leads to truth decay" - unknown

the loss of the catholic healthcare system. I think even non Catholics have experiences the loss of this and desire it back

the loss of all the small family dairy farms and the change it has made on our ways of life

Society in general lack of morals 0 belief in God and people don't care loss of faith

a new priest which we love but will be leaving soon a very traditional priest many left some have return others not

loss of mother recently and dad about 30 years ago consequently siblings not as close loss of job health deteriorating

just for fewer people who would like to have a kneeler for communion there are kneelers in the church still the vast majority are patience with church changes there is a head of humility among people who project their wants

That we will continue to loose parishioners that we will not have enough priests.

the death of my husband having to sell the hobby farm we built and moving in our parish the rapid change of priest

The loss of my parents and oldest brother-the change of the current administration

- Too many self-centered people.
- Loss of journaling for our youth of daily experiences.
- Opportunity to regain their self-esteem.
- penmanship or cursive that uses both sides of the brain.

That all my family are not in the Catholic church anymore. One nephew died of cocaine and fentanyl overdose

children grew up have their own life and family they have chosen not to have kids baptized leave the area and are forgotten

Loss of change of priest. Had relationship with past priests and as it is hard to accept. Lets me pull away from the church

my mother passed so our get togethers are different

closing down

My children are no longer practicing Catholics. The parish I loved changed DRASTICALLY. I changed parishes.

some of my family members left the church not sure who might be a "I don't wanted to live the way anymore" don't see the value social media has ruined a lot of community involvement and caused people to walk away from God

loss and respect to our elders and parents no unity

Lack of Masses in my parish. Children left church. No CCD.

Declining health of parents

loss of parents sister sisters in law retirement good changes but still a change/adjustment closings o four catholic hospitals family members not practicing their catholic faith

*age is causing some decline in activity *painful divorce of a child

Communion in the hand-women in sanctuary-cancelling traditional Mass! Nakedness at Mass-wordly music-Holy Days cancelled-No Mass on Saturday morning, Mondays-changing Word of God-modern technology

we have lost our school. Some of the parishioner have been pushed away because they didn't give enough or were not liked by priest. We are getting some new people attending mass and helping with mass

low attendance/youth/young adults marriage are in parks not churches less baptism less communion/confession less confirmation less marriages couples live together w/o matrimony

dyslexia, dysgraphia and dyscalculia. Not being close (3 hrs. away) hurts

to see mom and dad not loving each other and ultimately putting themselves before us my best
friend's brother taking his life

while I don't have a strong tie to the traditional Latin Mass the marginalization and cancelling of
the mass and denigration of those that adhere to it is wrong and painful

loss of young peoples at church youth 20 somethings and 30 somethings we've lost a lot

*I am new to the diocese and have spent the last 12 years in campus ministry, so I'm not sure my answer will reflect life here or at a standard parish. I suppose my biggest loss and change would be leaving my job in Texas and moving here

many of the parishioners who were very involved in various committees have passed on and few people have replaced them

as our family grows and need us less, it's a feeling of loneliness. But silence came to lose my thoughts and hear Jesus. For my parish, I wish it to be more vibrant and the lack of people makes it hard. So I feel that silence in church and I think silence can lead me closer to Jesus

Loss of parents & sister.

*mass schedule and changes in mass schedule *losing parishioners due to mass scheduling

having priest that have come from parishes with more wealth not understanding the tight budgets rural parishes have to deal with having the blood with the Eucharist since covid we've been to one Mass that has had the hosts offered to the lay catholic

that we would be busy with all sorts of activities and call that success and accept that instead of everyone's conversion and holiness

Loss of relative & heart problems

some of my adult children do not attend church - in the community people get burned out and no longer want to have to always be the ones to work

parents aging and loss of pillars that shaped me as a person

our community is losing much of the store fronts and businesses our pastor has his back to us instead of facing the people the community is becoming mainly Amish I lost my husband and best friend 3.5 years ago

It broke my heart how that can kill the spirit of a community that was actively involved

My husband lost his abilities due to MS and back pain-he won't be returning to work-I HATE that Mosinee will not changes its mascot which reflects systemic racism-literally the person (Native American person) who started the quest to change mascots is from Mosinee and we won't change

the loss of understanding/unity among the people. Everything is so divided now everywhere you go - loss of Saturday Mass - loss pf young people/families

brother who is gay who grew up with a strong faith, but when he came to better understand his sexual orientation and wanted to talk about that, seek guidance from the church, felt actively rejected. He left the church and the faith

Franciscan Skemp Healthcare changed to Mayo Clinic Health System. *my parents have passed away *I was diagnosed with cancer *my husband left the catholic faith for non-denomination church

losing associate pastors - Fr Becher/Fr Reider. Post-Christian culture - anti-Catholic./anti-Christian attacks/vandalism. Family members leaving the church

so few people are at Mass

Most of my family stopped practicing their faith-less people involved in parish-festivals struggle-no clarity-lies and division in parish's history haunt current members

A declining number of families in our parish due to aging-locking the church on weekdays so that quick visits aren't possible even though I know it's for security reasons

hard to accept that our church will be undergoing probably drastic change that will de-personalize the time and report with parish priest direct contact our fate is in the hands of the bishop who was definitely not there for us during covid our leadership lacks backbone

lost families to other churches our oldest graduated from St. Pats and is now attending public school catholic schools. We are now in our 4th year @ catholic school that was a role change for us

changes at St. Johns church after Fr. Martin's departure included discontinuation of a Saturday Mass and limited opportunities for the sacrament of reconciliation Fortunately some very important changes were truly positive including 24 hr adoration 7 days a week and 1st Friday Mass and opportunity for the sacrament of reconciliation so those need to be noticed too

I moved here recently from another diocese. We have lost: *regularly seeing old friends, of course *the ability to easily go to confession or adoration, because times are more limited here *music quality - our old parish had an excellent trained choir, a choir school for children to learn to sing, and more singable music (hymns and simple chants)

I've lost the last half hour of my time. I'm sure this is helping a few people, but the vast majority want you to get to the point of why we're here

I left one west side parish after 40 plus years of membership because I could no longer listen to the anti-trans rhetoric I miss some of my fellow parishioners (there is a gay family member) - my current parish shares the pastor with 3 parishes

empty nest, children not committed to Catholic Church

Then he conducted confession very questionable. 1st communion and other practices were handled poorly along with handling server training very poorly. large families with many children became very dismayed at the formation their children were now (not) receiving His attitudes toward the USA became very evident condescending bigoted offensive we prayed much for him tried talking with and explaining many things to him he brushed us off and became very aloof and resistant. Many people left about 50 people in just a few months very sad our family tried to stay for a few years but he refused sacramental assistance for us in a very critical moment so we had to eventually leave we have not felt at home at a parish since lots of disorder in our deanery as a whole. We are so grateful for our dean as well as for our new pastor bringing stability and spiritual revitalization. Please give our parishes in this deanery a chance to recover from some very poor pastorship in several parishes and Covid after effects before deciding to close any parishes
