

Statewide Elder Abuse Interventions and Enhanced Multidisciplinary Team Initiative

Background

Enhanced Multidisciplinary Teams (E-MDTs) intervene in complex cases of elder abuse. They bring together professionals from various disciplines, including but not limited to Adult Protective Services, aging services, health and human services, and law enforcement to provide an effective and efficient means of addressing abuse of older adults (aged 60 and older). The enhancement comes with access to forensic accountants, geriatric psychiatrists/mental health professionals, and civil legal services.

The E-MDT model was piloted in eight counties from 2012-2016 using federal funds. During 2016-2017, New York State provided funding to sustain the existing E-MDTs and establish or enhance teams in five additional counties, for a total of thirteen. Building upon this success, in 2017 the NYS Office for Victim Services and NYS Office for the Aging partnered to establish and implement the Statewide Elder Abuse Interventions and E-MDT Initiative. The E-MDT Initiative is coordinated Statewide by Lifespan of Greater Rochester. Lifespan and the New York City Elder Abuse Center work together to provide technical assistance and training to E-MDTs across New York State and with NYSOFA to provide strategic planning to the Initiative.

Expanded Access

The Elder Abuse E-MDT Initiative continues to expand, with the goal of having a team in every county. The county-based E-MDTs are being implemented through an E-MDT Regional Hub model, in which a host organization is responsible for E-MDT establishment, coordination, and implementation in each of the counties in its E-MDT region. There are 11 regions that have been established for this Initiative (see attached table). As of July 2021, there are 53 counties in eleven E-MDT Regional Hubs with operational E-MDTs funded through this Initiative. The remaining counties are in development.

Services and Components

Services provided to abuse victims through E-MDT interventions include information about and referral to other types of services (e.g., victim service programs, legal services, etc.) and individual advocacy (e.g., return of personal property, assistance with applying for public benefits, etc.). E-MDT Coordinators provide case consultation on cases as well as access to consultation services such as a forensic accountant, geriatric psychiatrist/mental health professional, and civil legal attorney, as appropriate and available. Additionally, as part of the E-MDT Initiative, Lifespan of Greater Rochester holds monthly webinars for professionals on financial exploitation.

During the COVID-19 public health crisis, E-MDTs have continued to meet virtually, ensuring continued interventions in elder abuse cases and protections for New York's older adults during a time when many other programs have been forced to pause.
