True to form... MOE funding ran out and Rm 5 remain with us. Never the less our Year 8 students and Whaea Gaylene love their new learning space and deck.









This leads me to our next Ministry of Education building project. We currently have two running together.

Nga Iti Kahurangi Project - Improving classrooms in small or rural school. These engineers are improving sound control, electrics, lighting (LED), carpeting and insulation. This project will finish at the end of this week.

Dream Builders Kerikeri (School 5YA) - This company is involved in installing moving walls between Room 1, 2 and 3. Plus they will be creating an amazing learning space for our Year 1 (new entrants) class.

Just letting our whanau know, MOE will not build a new hall for our school (bureaucratic decisions made from the top) so I had to think outside of the square. Creating moving walls and making a mini hall, in our old sturdy Rm 1 to 4 building will help the school meet in comfort when the weather is shocking.

For this to happen, our Year 2 and 3 students are in the technology class and next week our wee 5 year old will move to our library. This project will take 16 weeks to complete.

Māori New Year:

Puanga/Matariki was a time to acknowledge the dead, reflect, give thanks for the harvest, and share bounty with family and friends.

Navigation:

Voyaging waka navigators relied on Puanga/Matariki to guide them across the Pacific Ocean.

Harvest Prediction:

Tohunga (priests) would observe
Puanga/Matariki to predict the coming harvest
and the health of the upcoming seasons.

Cultural Significance:

Puanga/Matariki was deeply intertwined with Māori beliefs about creation, the environment, and the connection between humans and the natural world.
