Indivisible CA39 Poll Results 3/18

A huge "thank you" to each of you that voted! The ballots were sent out the morning of March 3 and voting closed early the morning of March 5.

In an effort to be as transparent as possible, there is quite a bit of information here. It is included, not to be confusing, but rather to explain as much as possible how this was conducted. Let's hope it makes sense to you!

BACKGROUND

Our Lists

- 1,715 Indivisible CA39 members on closed Facebook page
- 1,318 Indivisible CA39 members on our email list

600 (approximately) Indivisible CA39 "active" members, those for whom we have sign-in information from at least one event. Our sign in sheets are not 100% accurate. There are a few events where no sign ins were done, and many times the sign ins are illegible.

Ballots

600 (approximately) Number of ballots sent via email. The link was also posted on Facebook.

- 239 Number of ballots received
- 78 Number of senders who do not appear on our "active" lists = unconfirmed votes,
- 27 Number of the senders (in the 78 above) for whom we could find no match at all (Facebook, email, or sign in sheets). These ballots were not counted.
- 10 Number of ballots that were repeats (some people sent more than one ballot). These were not counted.

HOW THE VOTES WERE COUNTED

In announcing this process, we stated that only the votes of "active" members would be counted. Chris Hon ran the data through a program to figure out if first name, last name, or email matched our sign in records. If no match was found, those ballots went onto the "unconfirmed" list (the 78 ballots mentioned above).

A search was then done by Marian Bodnar to see if any of those names or emails matched our email list or our Facebook membership. There were 27 of these for whom no match could be made and therefore those ballots are not included in the results below.

You will see two sets of results. They appear in two lists:

- (1) The results from our "active" members
- (2) The results from all of the ballots for which we could find any match at all (including Facebook, email list, and sign in sheets).

You will see the number of votes each candidate received in each category. You will also see the number of points each candidate received. Points were tallied as follows: Each candidate received 3 points for every first place vote, 2 points for every 2nd place vote, and 1 point for every 3rd place vote.

(Although CA-39 allows filed candidates to withdraw before 3/14, other races still have a deadline on 3/9 for candidates to switch into.) Since I only have a single vote in June, my other choices represent uninformed Dem voters.

Too many candidates. Republicans may wind up with 2 top candidates.

Dr. Tran has a compelling story, but she is a poor candidate. She seems uninformed on the issues and does not live in the district (until recently, apparently.) Both Phil and Jay are young, well educated, and knowledgeable about the issues that matter to the people who live here, factors I believe will help them get elected in this district. They will appeal to both Democrats

and Independents on both sides of the hills. Gil's service and background are also compelling, but I think the lottery win is actually a negative as it, right or wrong, makes him appear not to be a self-made man. Andy does not live in this district and is too liberal to get elected in November. (He lives in Villa Park; he should be running in Mimi's district.) Sam sounds too much like he belongs in Silicon Valley, not CD 39. We are all for clean energy, but this district is not where those jobs are. In fact, this district has a background for more than a hundred years as providing good paying jobs in the oil, chemical, and aerospace industries. Many of those workers still live here. The best way to achieve a progressive agenda is to first win back Congress and then the White House. Democrats cannot win CD 39 if our candidate is too liberal. Learn from the lessons of Josh Newman. He has walked the district for a year and understands better than any other candidate what the people here want.
