

ROYAL DECREE NO. 2026-07-0726- M-A

Establishing a Streamlined Admission Procedure for States by Constitutional Submission

Section 1. Purpose.

This decree creates a faster path for admitting States to the Kingdom of Solmeria, using the authority granted under Article XII, Section 2, which lets the Monarch establish States by decree alone.

Section 2. Procedure.

A Territory or organized community may submit a proposed State Constitution to the Monarch for admission. The Monarch shall date-stamp the submission and notify Parliament in writing within 48 hours.

Section 3. Automatic Ratification.

If 14 days pass from the date of submission and neither the Monarch nor Parliament, by simple majority, has objected, the State Constitution is deemed ratified. The submitting Territory becomes a State of the Kingdom of Solmeria on the 15th day.

Section 4. Grounds for Objection.

The Monarch or Parliament may object at any point during the 14-day window because the proposed State Constitution fails to meet the requirements of Article XII, Section 2 — namely, that it does not provide for a republican government, does not acknowledge the sovereignty of the Crown, does not guarantee the rights in Articles IV and V, or lacks its own amendment process. An objection halts automatic ratification and returns the matter to the standard State-admission process.

Section 5. Judicial Review.

This decree does not limit the jurisdiction of the Constitutional Tribunal, or the Supreme Court once established, under Article VI. Any State admitted under this procedure remains subject to review under Article XII, Section 5, the same as any State admitted by Act of Parliament or standard Royal Decree.

Section 6. Effective Date.

This decree takes effect immediately upon issuance.
